Dear readers,

I am pleased to present you a new issue which brings with itself several new innovations.

In the preceding year we have made an intensive work towards the increasing level of specialization of the journal and its propagation in the international professional sphere. To the traditional old brand name *Národohospodářský obzor* we started to use an English language equivalent *Review of Economic Perspectives*. We have also advanced the web pages of the journal, where you can find all informations concerning the journal, current on-line issue as well as on-line archive of past issues. The journal has got newly a second ISSN for its electronic on-line edition.

Not least, we have made a contract with the international publisher Versita concerning the regular issue of the full text version of the journal. Due to this cooperation the published articles can attract wider international audience. Moreover, this is also increased by the technology used by Versita that can connect the quoted references in the articles with the web of other related manuscripts. For this reason and in accordance with the long term strategy we start to publish the manuscripts only in English language since this tenth anniversary of the journal (i.e. since 2010).

This year is the journal celebrating its tenth anniversary. We hope that the new changes will be to benefit for both authors and readers in the future years.

The current issue consists of three articles concerning the sectors of public transportation, health care and policy of development. The first article presents an evaluation of the competitiveness in the Czech rail system of passenger transport. It provides its analysis on the case study of the connections among main Czech towns. The second article is written from the theoretical point of view on different health systems. The author suggests a typology of health care system based on the division between public and private ownership and public and private system financing. In the framework of these divisions than shows the problematic points of each system. The third article devotes its attention to the industrial parks and their history in Europe and Slovakia. It offers a case study of the influence of the industrial parks on the unemployment in Slovakia.
