

All figures should be numbered with Arabic numerals. Every figure should have a caption. All photographs, schemas, graphs and diagrams are to be referred to as figures. Line drawings should be true electronic output. Figures must be embedded into the text without borders and not supplied separately. In MS Word input the figures must be

properly coded. Lettering and symbols should be clearly defined either in the caption or in a legend provided as part of the figure. Figures should be placed at the top or bottom of a page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference to them in the paper. **All figures/charts/graphs have to be .gif or .jpg (to make sure that nothing gets lost)**. Artwork has no text along the side of it in the main body of the text. However, if two images fit next to each other, these may be placed next to each other to save space. For example, see Figure 1.
