Please always check this fact in the MU library catalogue at: <https://katalog.muni.cz/>

For RECOMMENDED LITERATURE, it is up to the discretion of the teacher to determine to what extent it is necessary for the book to actually be in our library (CSI) - or if it is sufficient if it is in another MU library.

E-books and articles

In times of coronavirus pandemics and enforced library operational constraints, we highly recommend prescribing e-books or articles as study materials. These are usually not limited in number of users and can be read by "all" students and faculty without restriction.

FEA MU has subscription access to the Bookport database of Czech e-books for all its students and staff, which includes more than 400 titles in Business, Economics and Finance; more than 200 titles in Law, Tax and Accounting; and more than 500 titles in Psychology and Education.
