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Questions for the Dissemination Phase

Are questionnaires, surveys, focus groups etc. designed to identify potentially relevant gender/sex differences in the research field?
Are the samples balanced in terms of sex (if 50/50 is unachievable, then at least 40/60)?
Is data analysed according to the gender/sex variables?
Are other relevant variables (for example, age or occupation) analysed with respect to gender/sex?
If the answer to any of these questions is 'no', is a justification provided?



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Questions for the Dissemination Phase

(or plan to include) the statistics, tables, figures and descriptions that focus on relevant gender differences?
Are institutions, departments and journals with a focus on gender issues included in the target groups for dissemination?
Does the proposal/project include a specific publication or event on gender related findings?
Does the proposal/project use gender sensitive language in all dissemination and communication activities?
