- There are more than 68 native languages





Pre Hispanic

- Bring gifts for Mictlantecuhtli and Mictecacihuatl

After colonization

- Provide the souls with food for them to enjoy in the afterlife

The elements of the altar

- A picture of your beloved deceased
- Incense and copal
- Flowers arc
- Paper
- Candles
- Water
- Cempasúchil flower
- skulls (made of sugar or chocolate)
- Food
- Things the deceased liked





The celebration lasts more than one day

- 27th October: Pets come to visit us
- 28th October: People who died tragically or in an accident
- 30th October: Dedicated to the forgotten souls
- 31st October: Unborn kids or unbaptized kids
- 1st November: All kids younger than 12 years
- 2nd November: All the adults who passed away

Interesting facts about Día de Muertos”

- Each altar has representations of the four elements
- In 2003 this tradition was recognized by the UNESCO as intangible human patrimony
- The Catrina represents the presence of the death among the living people
- People think this is a sad celebration but is all the way around!!
