

# **Conditions and requirements for admission to study in programmes of study taught in a foreign language at the Faculty of Education, Masaryk University**

## **I. Basic admission requirements in accordance with § 48 Act No. 111/1998 Coll., Higher Education Act**

1. Admission to study in a Bachelors programme is conditioned by completion of secondary school, with a school-leaving certificate from a general or specialised secondary school.
2. Admission to study in a Masters programme which is a continuation of a Bachelors programme is conditioned by successful completion of a Bachelors programme of study.

## **II. Further admission requirements in accordance with § 49 Act No. 111/1998 Coll., Higher Education Act**

1. In programmes and fields of study determined by the Dean, admission to study in a Bachelors programme and in a Masters programme which is a continuation of a Bachelors one may be conditioned by testing an applicant for certain knowledge, abilities and talents, which can take the form of a specialised test or an audition.
2. In the case of admission to study in a Masters programme which is a continuation of a Bachelors programme the faculty may set out the conditions with regard to the similarity of the fields of study.
3. Another condition for admission to study in a Masters programme which is a follow-up to a Bachelors programme of study may be assessment of the student's performance in the relevant Bachelors study. This assessment is part of the entrance examination.
4. Admission to study in a Bachelors programme and in a Masters programme which is a continuation of a Bachelors programme of study is ranking among the best applicants resulting from assessment of all parts of the entrance examination in compliance with its assessment criteria.

## **III. Criteria for assessment of the entrance examination according to § 49, section 5 Act No. 111/1998 Coll., Higher Education Act**

1. Assessment of an entrance examination will be based on percentiles. A percentile is calculated on the basis of the number of correct answers in the relevant variant of the applicant's entrance examination. The percentile states how many applicants (in percentage) had the same or a lower score.
2. The total result of an applicant's entrance examination will equal the sum of percentiles gained in individual parts of the entrance exam.
3. Specialised tests and auditions in one field of study (if they are required by the Dean) are assessed by the hundredth percentile as the maximum and the first percentile as the minimum.
4. The order of applicants is determined by ranking them by the total of relevant percentiles gained in individual parts of the entrance examination.
