MU FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS


The survey addressed a total of 8,070 first-year bachelor's and long-term master's students who entered MU in 2022. A total of 5,182 respondents completed the questionnaire, which represents a return rate of 64%.

Applications to MU:

20 % of students applied to only 1 university in the admission procedure, i.e. to MU.

For 3/4 of those with multiple applications, studying at MU was a first choice.

Those who did not have their current degree programme as a priority most often preferred other studies at MU.



Entry criteria for admission to MU met:

8% of freshmen faced complications in the admissions process

2/3 were admitted to more than one study programme, the average was 2 programmes
