The second does not express a complete thought. It is a **sentence fragment**.

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A sentence fragment does not have all the basic parts of a <u>complete sentence</u>.

Fragments do not express a complete thought and are missing important information.

Reached the campsite early. No subject

The ground muddy and wet after the storm.

Because the tent had a leak in it.

How to fix a sentence fragment Add a subject

To fix a sentence fragment, first figure out which piece is missing.

If the word group is missing a subject, add a subject to make it into a complete sentence.

Fragmente sentence

Every day he fed her a special food. o subject. Who fed her?
