Session 2: Traditions

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Session objectives

• This session aims to acquaint students with a variety of tools and approaches that will help them explore the importance of traditions in different societies, in order to understand the complex nature of this concept. This will allow them foster their pluricultural repertoire and develop their pluricultural competence.

1 Group work - preparation

- Form pairs, or groups of 3 and choose one of the topics to learn about and present.

- Each group has a set of learning tasks to complete that include listening and reading tasks.
- Work together as a group to finish all the tasks.
- When you're ready, prepare a mini presentation for the other people in the class.

- **Traditions** 1. What are some traditions that your family observes regularly?
 - 2. How do traditions help in maintaining cultural heritage and identity?
 - 3. Can you name a tradition that has evolved over time in your community?
 - 4. Why do you think it is important to pass on traditions to future generations?
 - 5. How can traditions help in building a sense of community and belonging?
 - 6. What are some ways to keep traditions alive in a rapidly changing world?

Rituals

- 1. What role do rituals play in religious or spiritual practices in your culture?
- 2. How do rituals differ from traditions, and what are their unique significance?
- 3. Can you describe a common ritual performed during a significant life event (e.g., birth, marriage, death)?
- 4. How do rituals help in marking important milestones in an individual's life?
- 5. In what ways do rituals help in strengthening family bonds and relationships?
- 6. How can participating in rituals enhance an individual's understanding of their culture and beliefs?

- Ceremonies 1. What are some key ceremonies observed in your culture, and what is their significance?
 - 2. How do ceremonies help in the transition of individuals through different stages of life?
 - 3. Can you explain the importance of a specific ceremony in maintaining social order and cohesion?
 - 4. How do ceremonies serve as a means of expressing collective values and beliefs?
 - 5. What role do ceremonies play in reinforcing community identity and continuity?
 - 6. How can ceremonies be adapted to reflect contemporary values while preserving their traditional essence?

Festivities

- 1. How do festivities contribute to the cultural and social life of a community?
- 2. What are some major festivities in your culture, and what do they celebrate?
- 3. How do festivities help in fostering a sense of unity and togetherness among participants?
- 4. In what ways do festivities provide opportunities for cultural expression and creativity?
- 5. How can festivities promote intercultural understanding and appreciation in a multicultural society?
- 6. What impact do festivities have on the economy and tourism in your region?

These questions are designed to stimulate discussion and reflection on the role and significance of traditions, rituals, ceremonies, and festivities in various cultural contexts.
