We use must and have to to say that it is necessary to do something. Sometimes it doesn't matter

But there is a difference between must and have to and sometimes this is important:

If you are not sure which to use, it is usually safer to use have to.

You can use must to talk about the present or future, but not the past:

- We must go now.
- We must go tomorrow. (but not 'We must go yesterday')

You can use have to in all forms. For example: I had to go to hospital. (past)

- Have you ever had to go to hospital? (present perfect)
   I might have to go to hospital. (infinitive after might)

In questions and negative sentences with have to, we normally use do/does/did: What do I have to do to get a driving licence? (not 'What have I to do?')
