Wall Painting,, Pompei

Although the murals of ancient Greece have not been preserved, Pliny the Elder states in *Naturalis historia* the story of Zeuxia (5th century AD), which painted a still life with grapes so perfectly that deceived the birds and they hit the wall. His rival - the painter Parrhasius then Zeuxius urged him to look at his painting, hidden behind a curtain. When Zeuxius wanted to do this and only finds that the curtain is actually a painting on the wall.

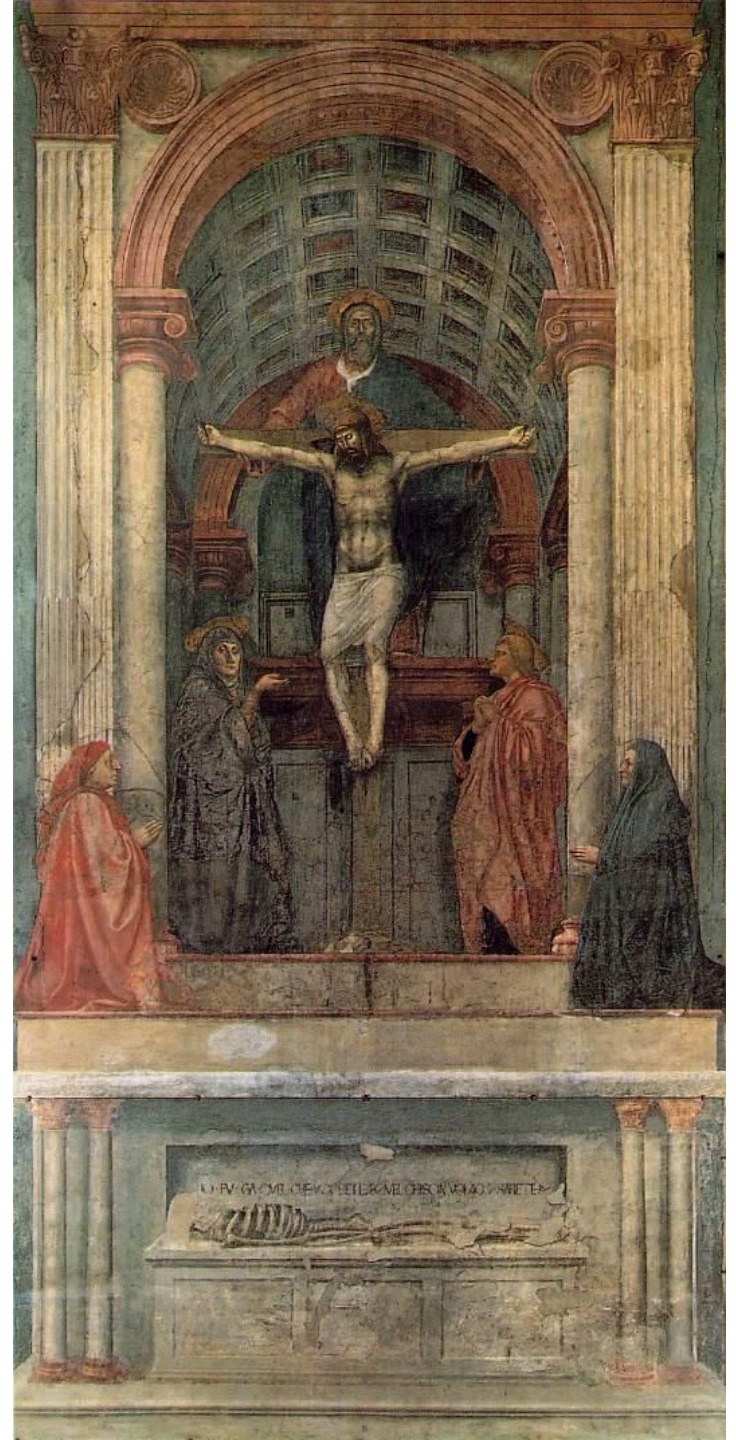

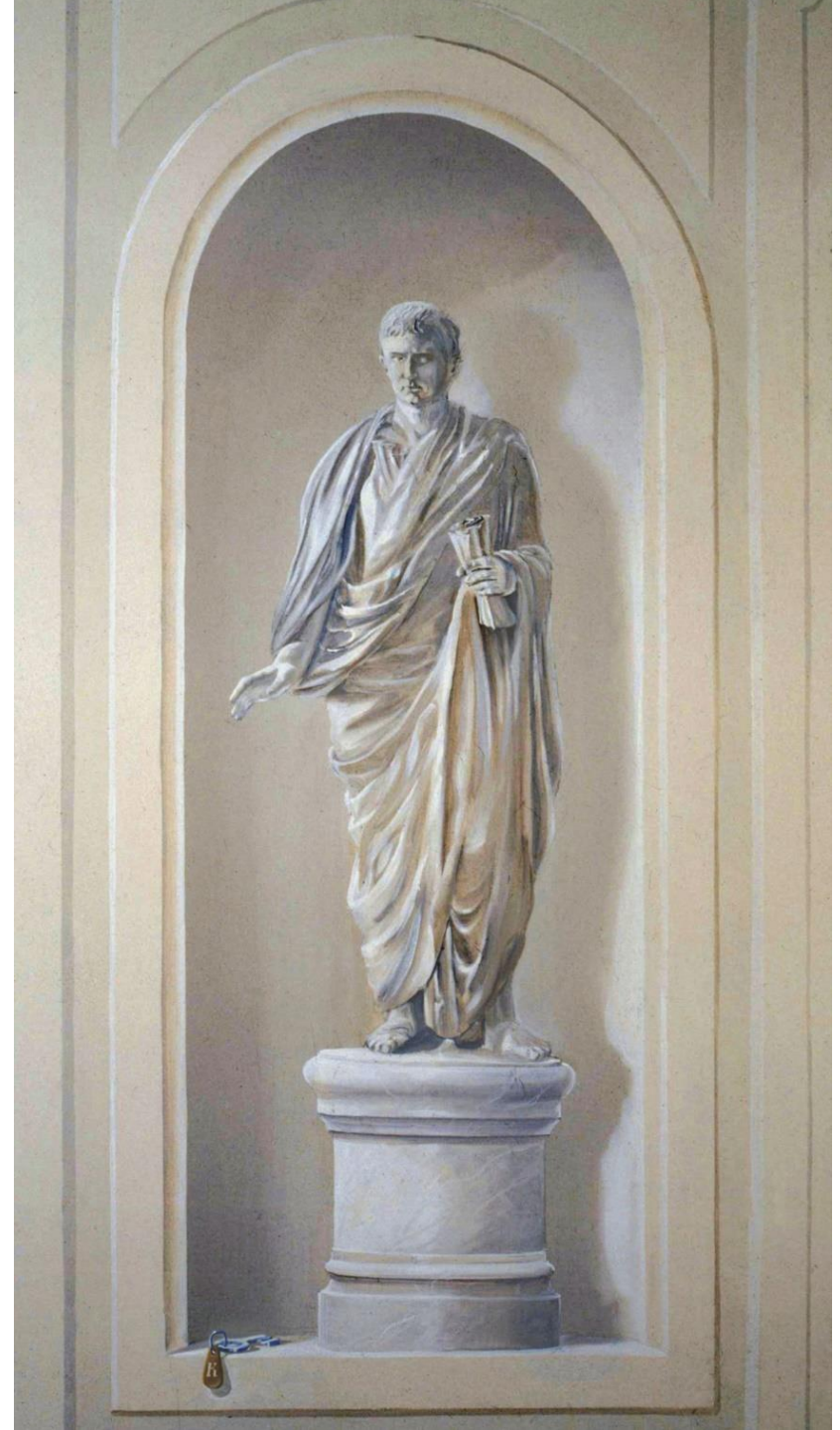

Ceiling Painting

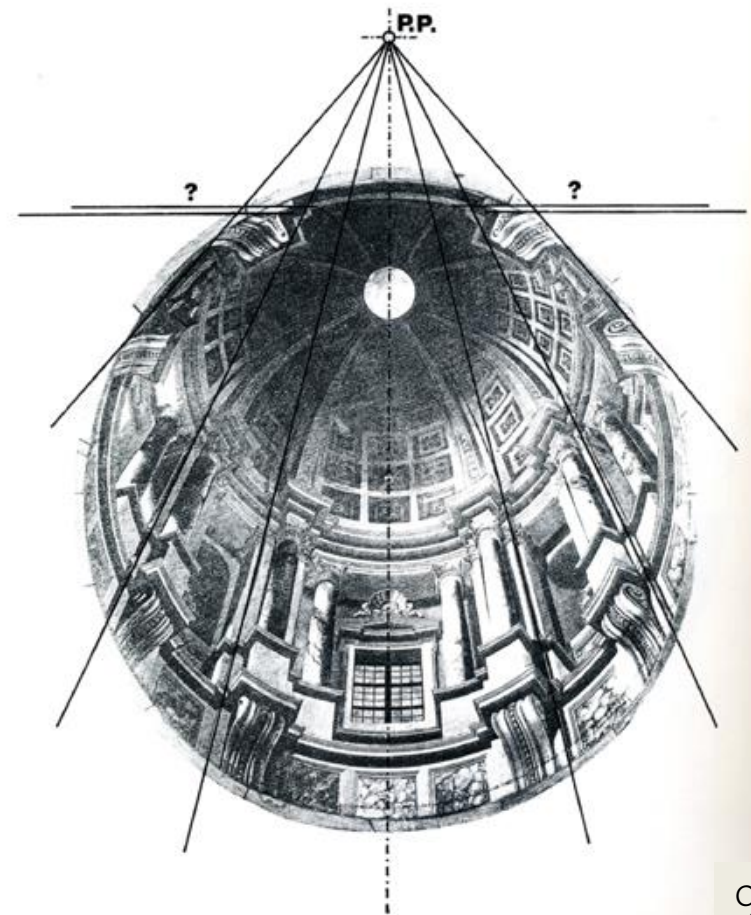
Perspective theory of the 17th century. focused on creating architectural illusions that "opened" a space limited by walls and ceilings. This type of painting is known as **quadratura**.

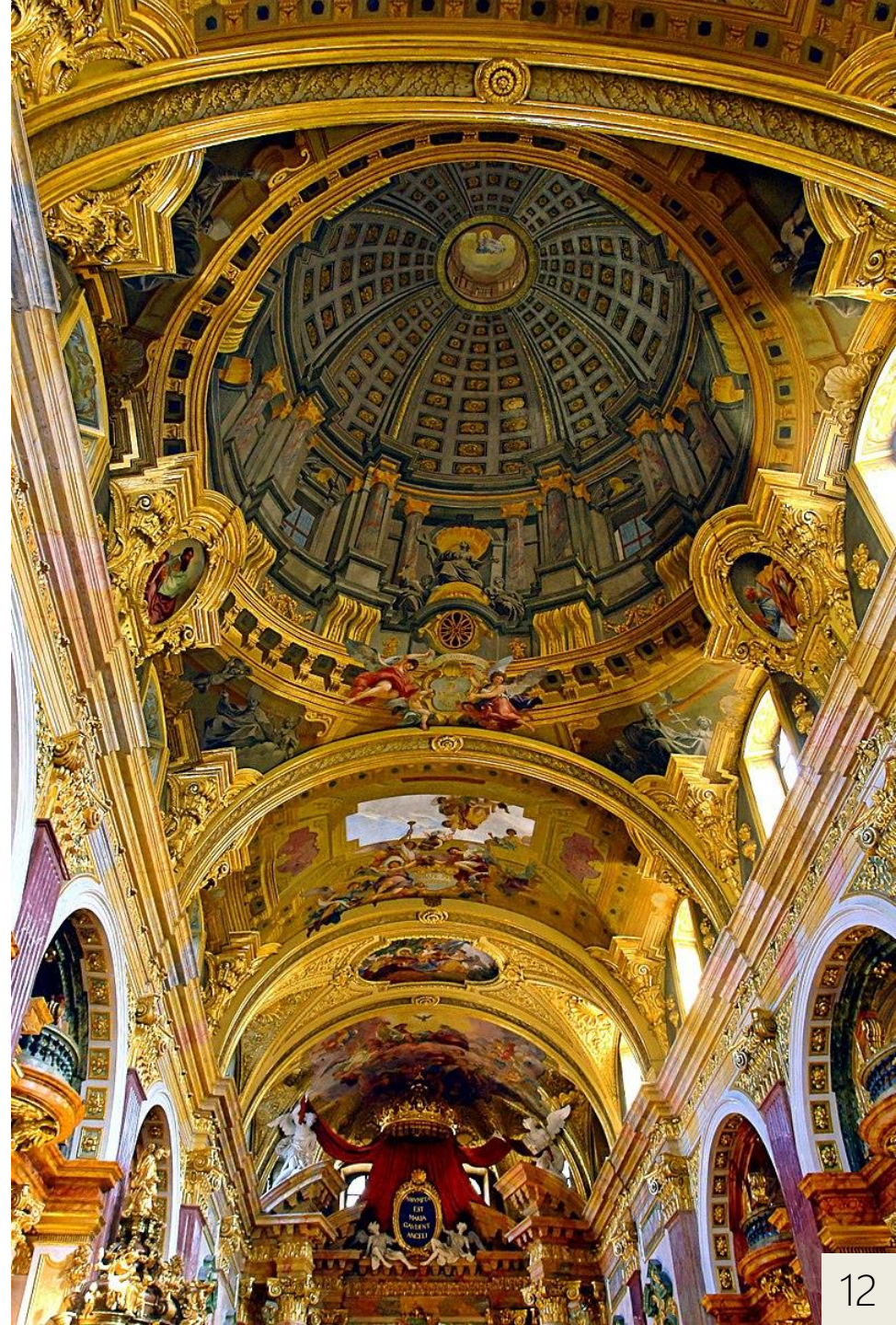

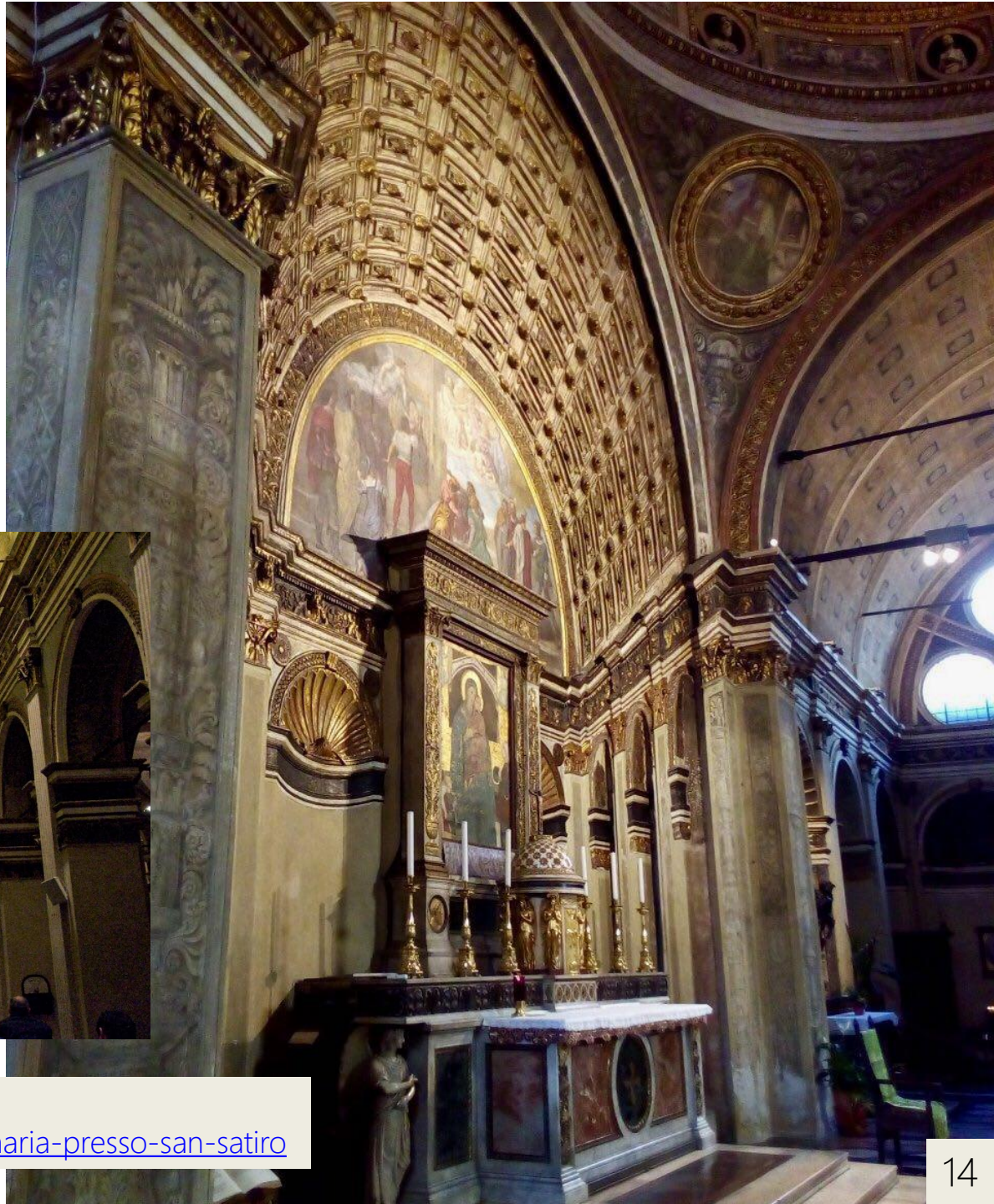
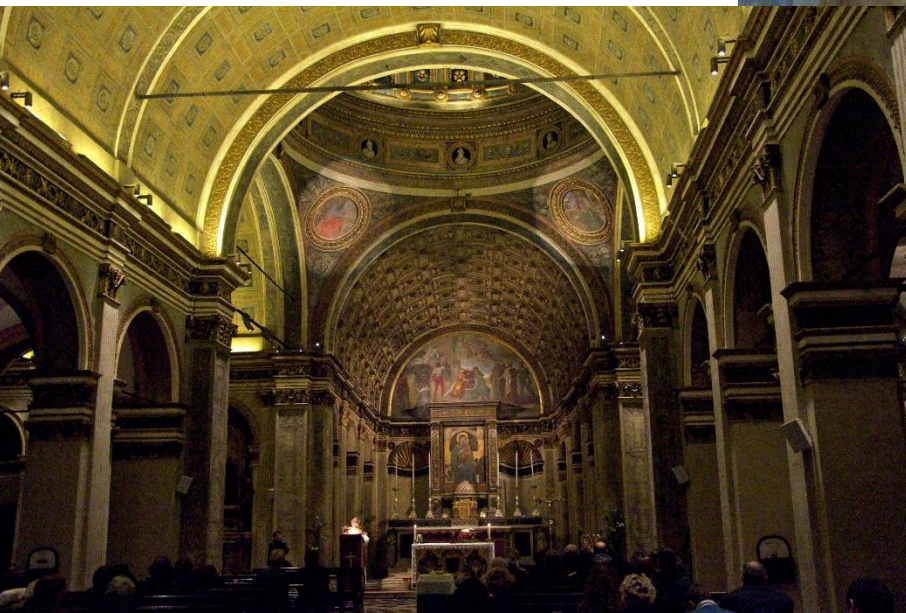
Trompe-l'œil - (in French "deceives the eye") refers to painting such a representation, which is illusory, creates the impression of three-dimensional object and space.

Quadratura - uses architectural elements to create convincing illusions that extend the visually existing architecture.

Projection on Architecture



Digital technologies allow the connection of illusion and reality, for example in video mapping, which works with the projection of images on the facades of houses. The projection is adjusted so that the projected image is not distorted. In essence, it repeats the principle of illusory paintings of the 17th and 18th centuries.

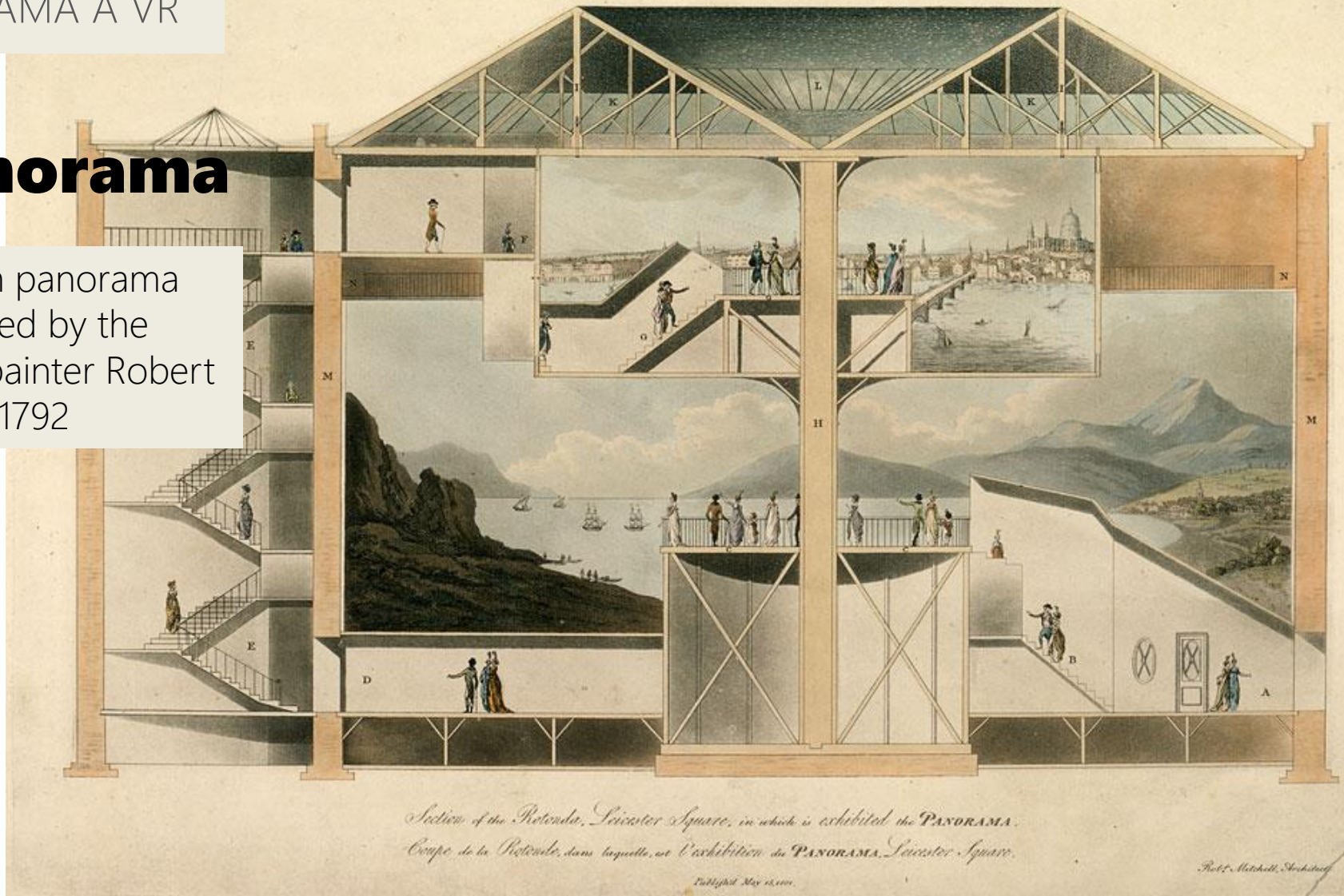

The term panorama was coined by the English painter Robert Baker in 1792



One of Robert Baker's most successful panoramas was created in London a rotunda was built in Leicester Square, where two could be seen panoramic images of London - Albion Mills and Edinburgh. To make people clear their minds and entered the second of the rested panoramas, walking down a dark staircase.

Think, for example, about certain ways the first-person perspective of V.R. actually limits what we see. Humans have evolved a complex apparatus for detecting the emotional states of others by intuitively assessing the micromuscular movements of the face. The paradox of V.R. is that when you see the world through someone else's eyes, you can't actually see the person's eyes. You can see what the person is seeing, but it's much harder to grasp what he or she is feeling. A cinematic close-up conveys emotional depth far more effectively than a point-of-view shot in a 360-degree film can. What V.R. does provide is so new that we don't really have a word for it: perceptual empathy, immersion sensors.

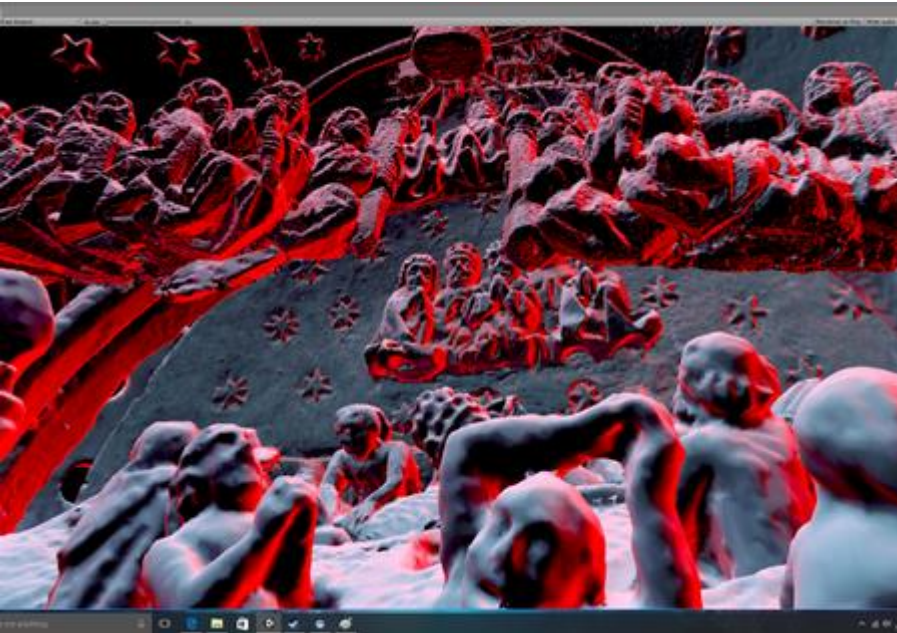

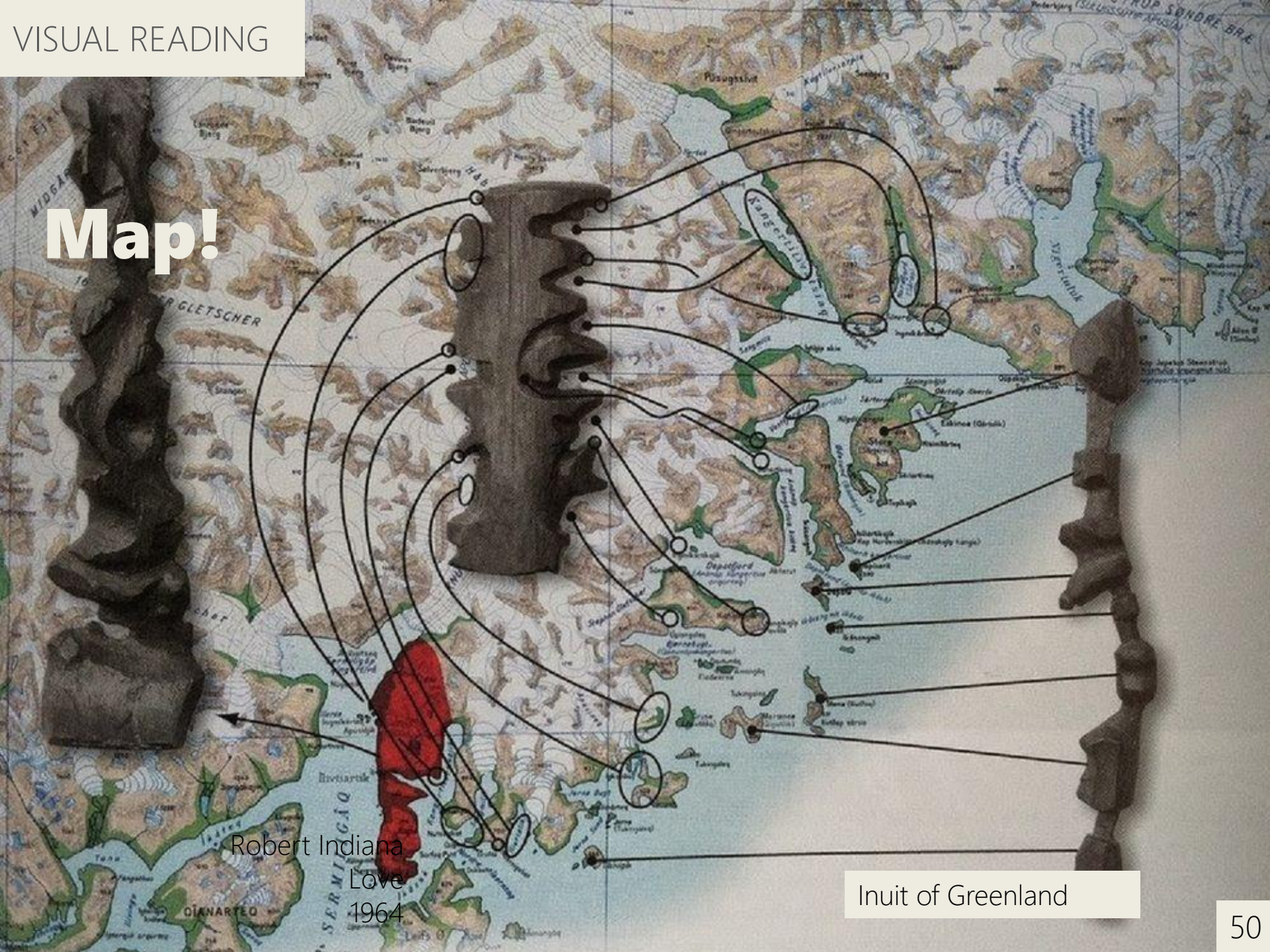

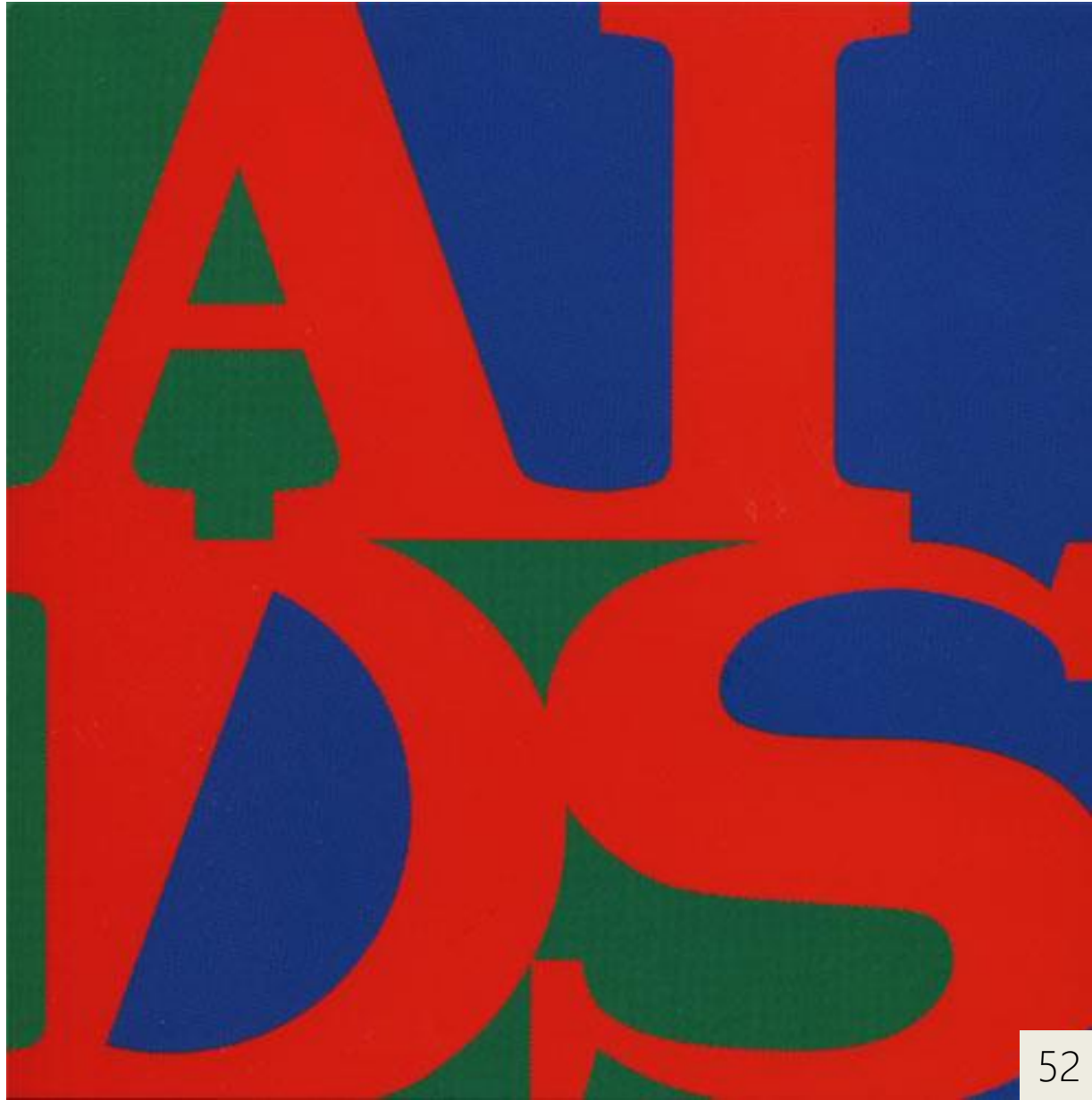

Familiar images or messages can have in another context new meaning. This is the so-called **appropriation**.

"Reading" an image presupposes knowledge of the "code" so that the viewer understands its meaning. (written text, symbols, characters, broader context and history).

ISOTYPE was developed for the needs of the Social and Economic Museum and was first known as the Vienna Method of Image Statistics (1930s).

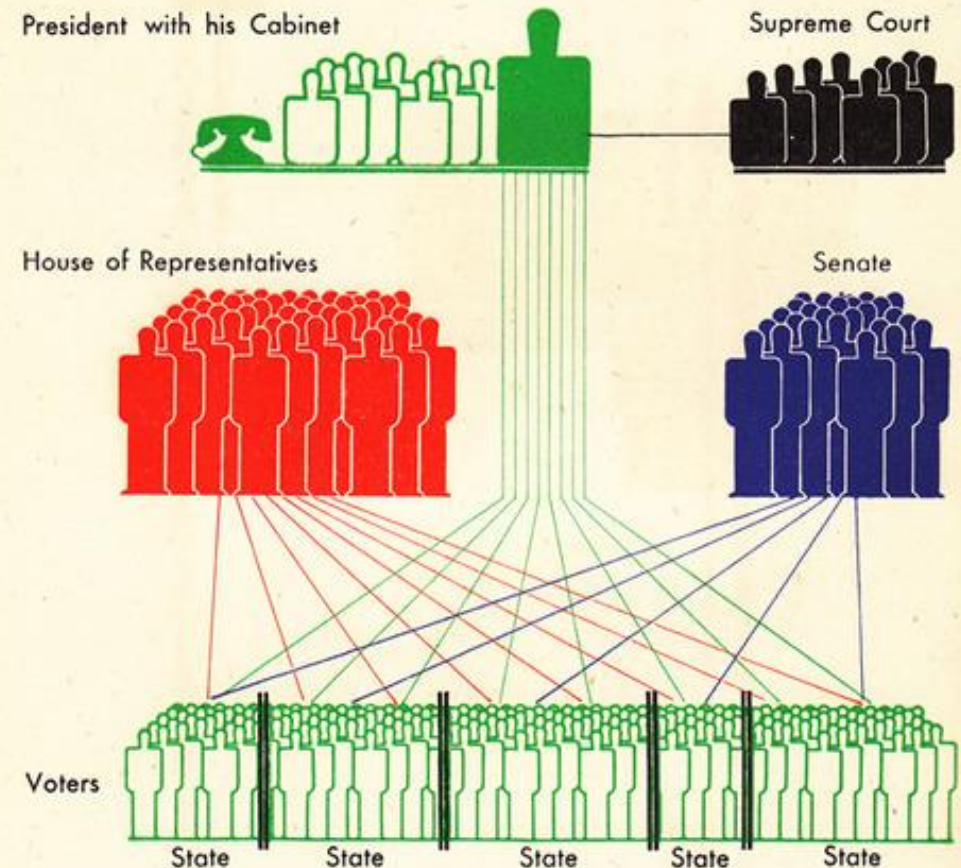

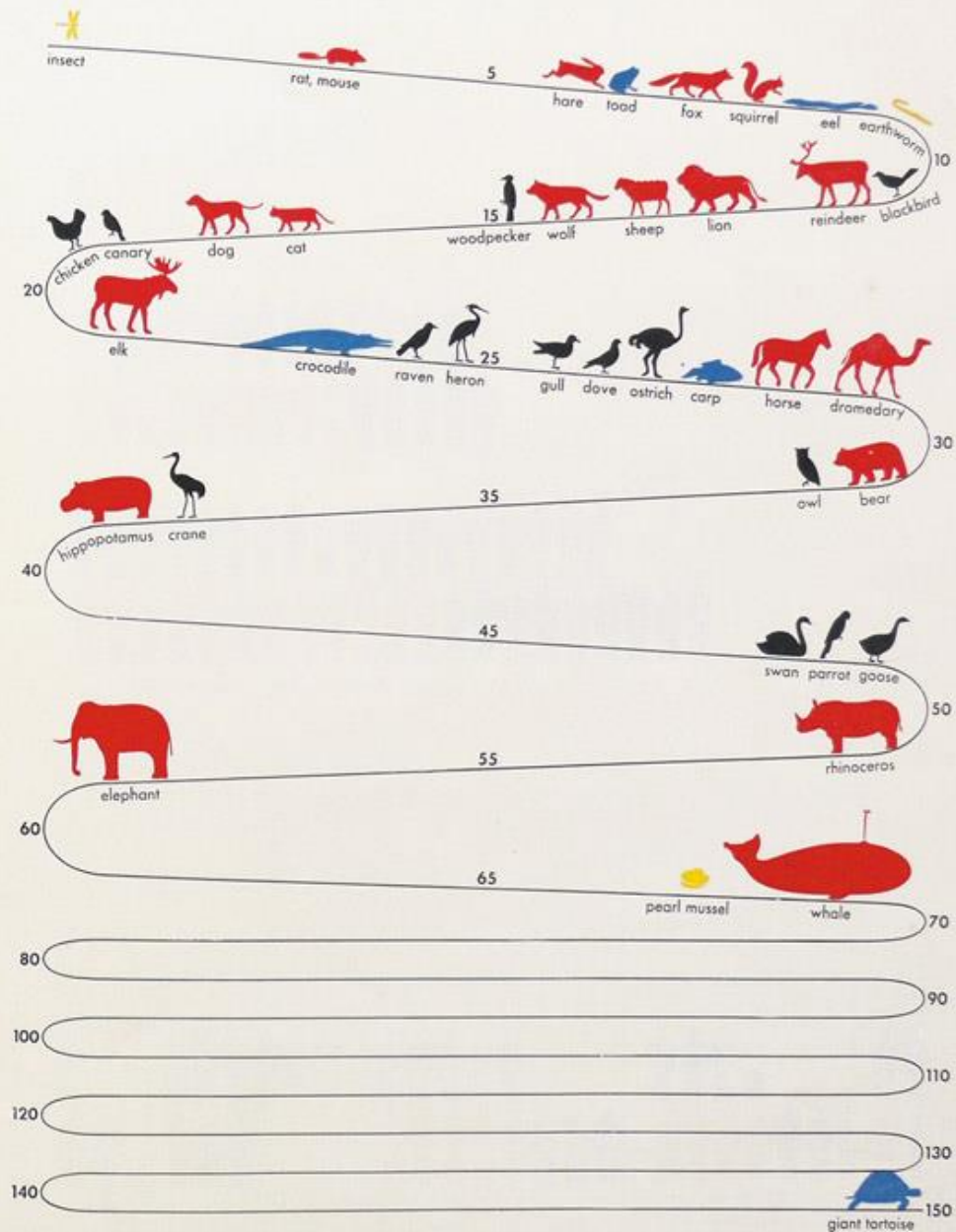
