- 5. There are 220 defibrillators and those carried by cycle team.
- 6. He signals by a set of blue lights, a horn, a siren and a cycle bell
- There are 3 altogether 1 for Terminals 1,2,3, 1 for Terminal 4 and 1 for Terminal 5
- 8. They treat a wide range of medical problems from minor injuries as slip trips for cardiac arrests, heart attacks, serious traumatic injuries
- 9. There is a special car with additional equipment and one ambulance
