## Icing and offside

<b>Icing</b> is infraction in sport of ice hockey. It occurs when player shoots
puck across both centre red line and opposing team's goal line, and puck
remains untouched. However, it is not icing if puck is shot from behind halfway
line into goal, or when shot must be played by opposing team's goaltender to
keep it out of net. In former case with shot puck crossing goal line
completely, goal is counted.
major exception is when team is shorthanded team trying to kill penalty
may legally "ice the puck" team on power play, however, must still follow icing
rules.
When icing occurs, linesman stops play. Play is resumed with faceoff in
defending zone of team that committed infraction.
In <u>ice hockey,</u> play is <b>offside</b> if player on attacking team enters
offensive zone before puck, unless puck is sent or carried there by
defending player. When offside violation occurs, linesman will stop play.
faceoff is then held at neutral ice spot closest to the infraction to restart play.
