Week 7: April 4^{th} 2005 - - The formation of gendered divisions of labor - paid-work (public sphere) and housework (private sphere)

AIM: TO ILLUSTRATE THE GENDERED DIVISION OF WORK WITHIN DIFFERENT TYPES OF FAMILIES

STEPS:

- A. Each group (5 students) will interview 5 couples:
 - one dual-earner couple (full time jobs both partners) with children age 0-6
 - one dual-earner couple (one or both partners have part-time job) with children age 0-6
 - one dual-earner couple (full time jobs both partners) with children age 7-15
 - one single-earner couple (where man is the breadwinner, woman is housewife) with children age 0-6
 - one dual-earner couple without children

Note: Please interview separately each respondent!

- B. Questions you should asked (Guideline):
 - Please estimate the amount of time that <u>you</u> spent performing housework <u>yesterday</u> (shopping, cooking, cleaning, home maintenance, ironing etc)
 - Please estimate the amount of <u>time per week you</u> spend performing housework (shopping, cooking, cleaning, home maintenance, ironing etc)
 - Please estimate the amount of <u>timer per week</u> that your <u>partner/spouse</u> spends performing housework (shopping, cooking, cleaning, home maintenance, ironing etc)
