ling poverty as it is conventionally understood. Needs will be interpreted exclusively as deprivations and, at best, the satisfiers that the system may generate will correspond to those identified in this book as singular. Last, but not least, linear assumptions will stimulate accumulation regardless of people's human development. Paradoxically, this option results in a circular cumulative causation (in the sense of Myrdal) and thus the poor remain poor inasmuch as their dependence on exogenously generated satisfiers increases.

If one opts for the systemic assumptions, the development strategy

will favor endogenously generated synergic satisfiers. Needs will be understood simultaneously as deprivations and potentials, thus allowing for the elimination of the vicious circle of poverty.

It follows from the above that the way in which needs are understood, and the role and attributes ascribed to the possible satisfiers, are absolutely definitive in determining a development strategy.
