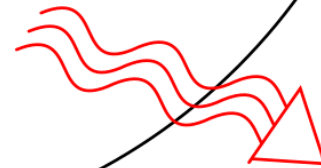

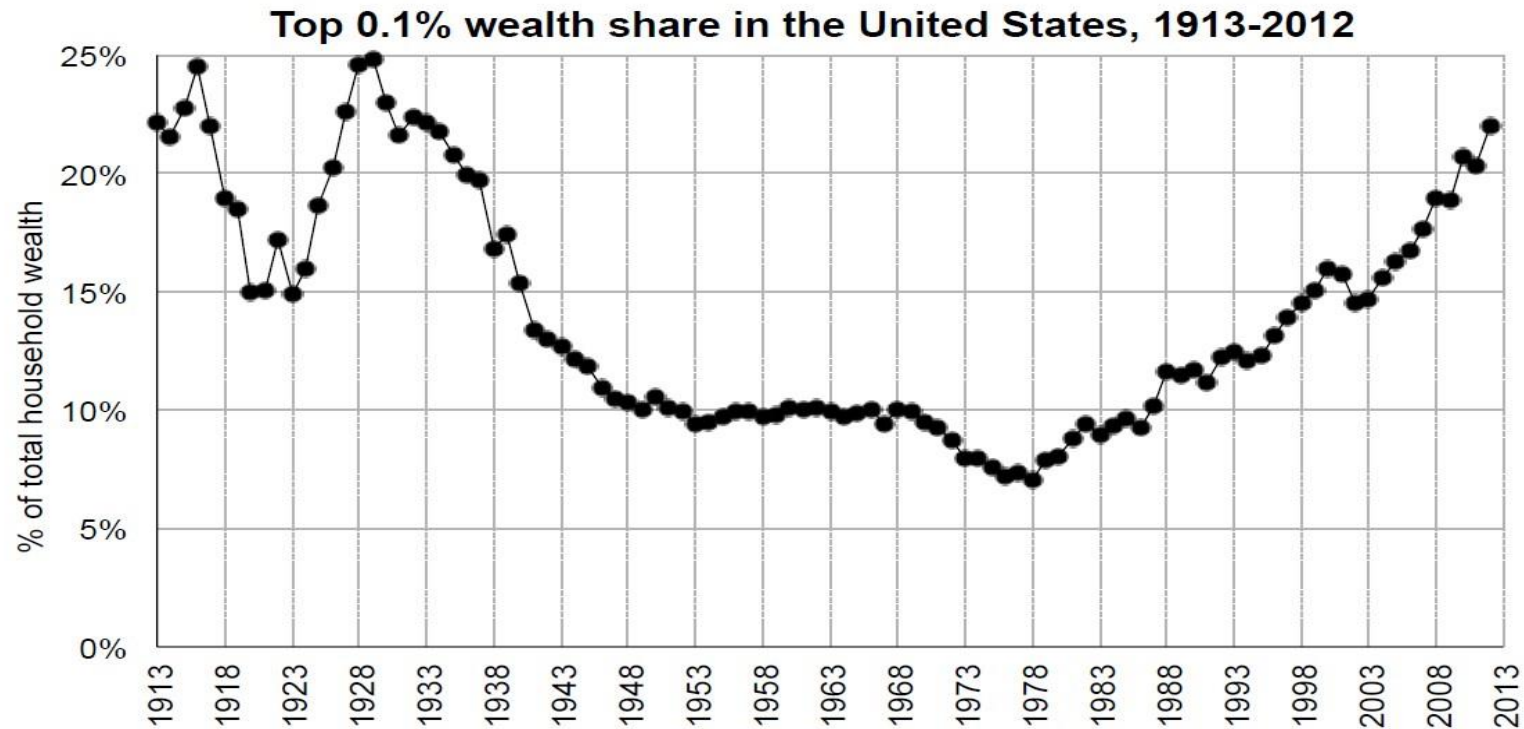

2 types of household

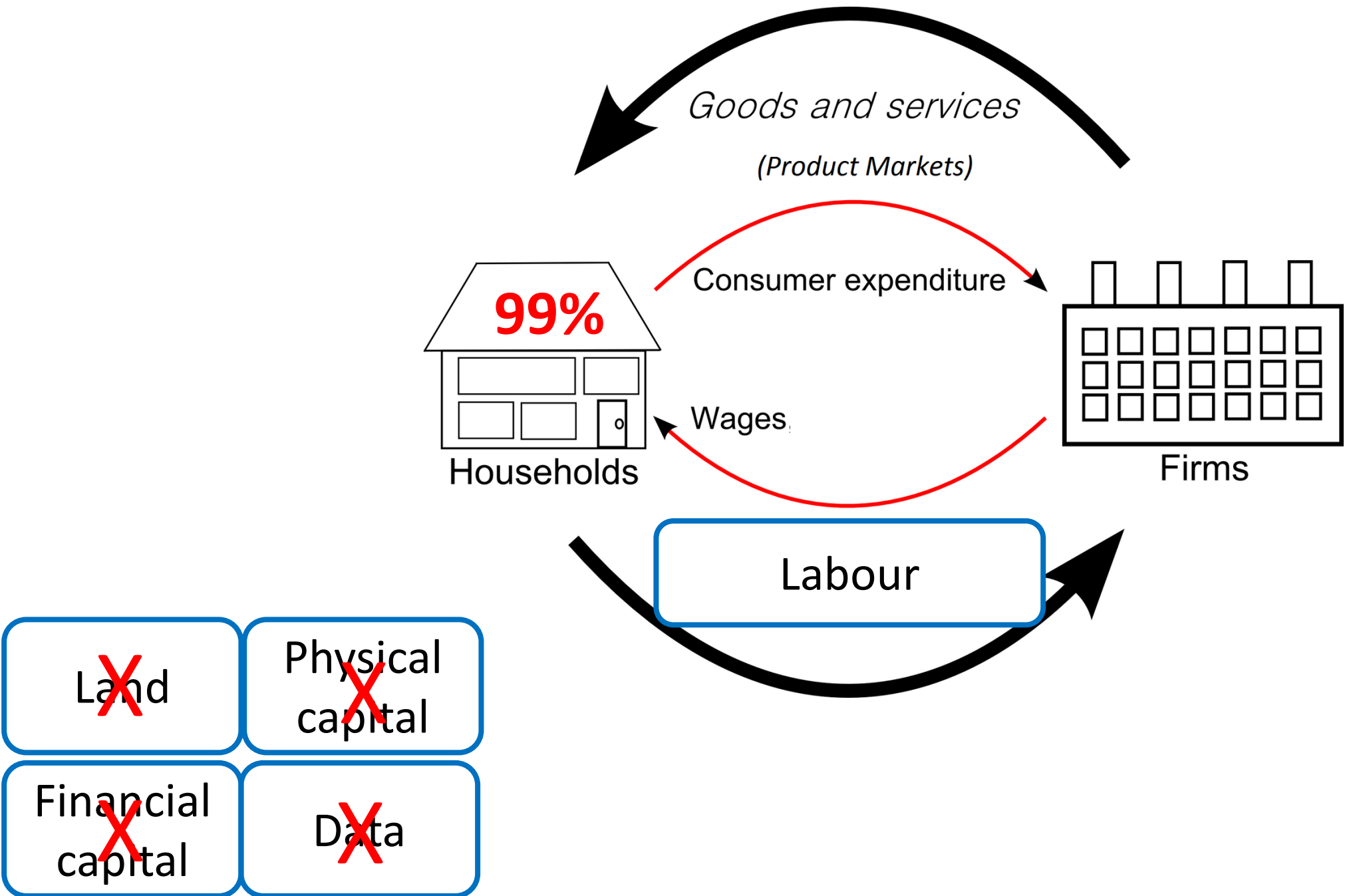
- The 99% - sell their labour and rely on *income*
- The 1% - own the other factors of production and their livelihoods are based on *wealth*

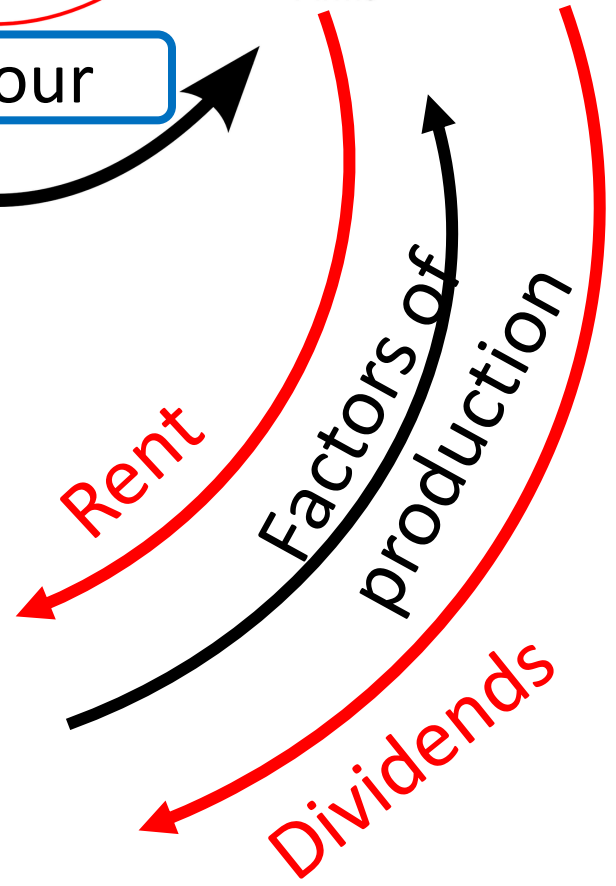
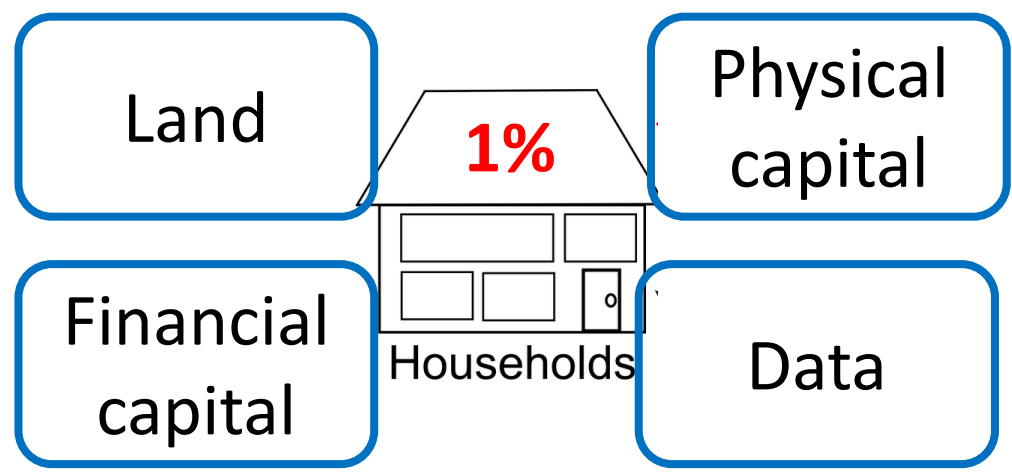
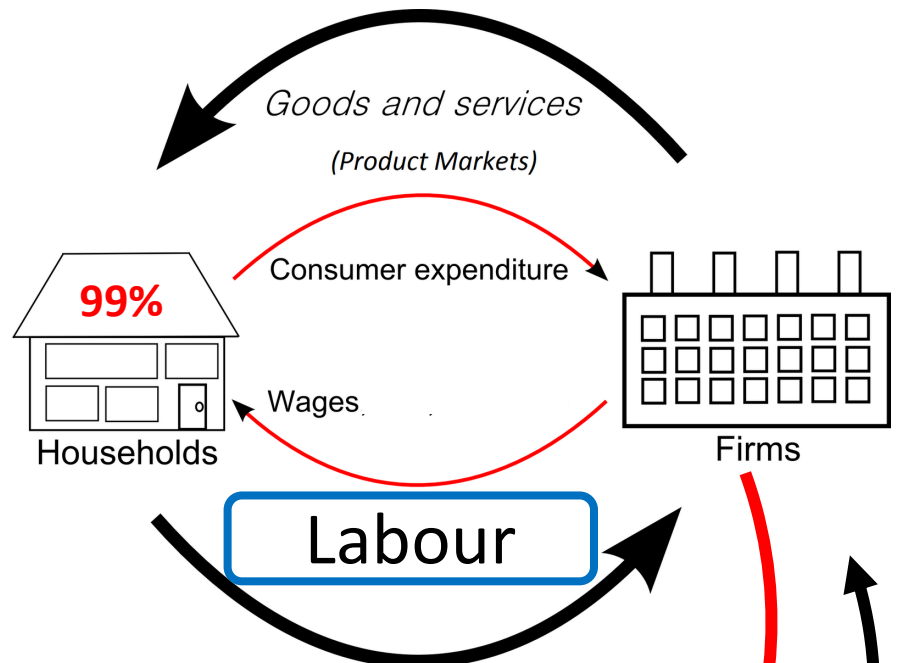
