


# Historical Development of Individualism

- Protestant ethic was motivated by personal, individual concern for going to heaven
- Legitimated profit motive & selfishness
- Encouraged personal wealth and display of status
- Before this time, Catholic Church promoted "just price"

#### Modern Manifestations


- Corporation: A social institution obligated to maximize profit and shareholder value
- Video: The modern corporation is a psychopath
- However, corporations can be helpful to society



#### Sociology and Individualism

 Durkheim: Industrialism and urbanization lead to greater individualization and more complex division of labor

- Can lead to:
  - Enhanced freedom and selfactualization
  - Anomie and alienation




#### Sociology and Individualism

- Beck, Giddens, and other contemporary sociologists theorize about individualization
- For example, changing patterns of:
  - Gender relations
  - Family life
  - Personal income and class relations
  - Consumption habits
  - Political identity and activity



- History of changing views of the body and relations with nature
- Canivalesque body = pre-modern body, living close to others and nature



Classical body = Enlightenment, civilized, refined care and presentation of the body









People today are more concerned with private goods (personal comfort and wellbeing) than public goods (parks, public transport, etc.)










 We try to control our bodies and our living environment to show our social status

– We want to tame / civilize / conquer nature &


our bodies' natural functions












Mikhail Bakhtin 1895-1975

- Similar to Erving
  Goffman's analysis
  of Presentation of
  Self in Daily Life
- Symbolic interactionism
  - Emphasis on "image management"

# Critique of Bakhtin

 Control of body & community cleanliness has important functional side to it – public health, hygiene









## Is Individualism Really So Bad?

Western – specifically Anglo-American, individualism – has emphasized democracy, respect for human rights, and quality of life


