Nature and Gender

- Are women are more connected with nature than men?
 - If yes, is this positive?
- How does social hierarchy affect resource use and distribution of power?



- Historical analysis
- Similar analysis as Bakhtin:
- There was a change in Europe in the 1600s – a shift from more the "organismic" social relations of a rural, pre-modern society to the more formal, mechanistic, rationalistic relations of an urbanizing, modernizing society



Carolyn Merchant 1936 -




- Western society is patriarchal
- Historically, women have been identified with nature as weak and inferior
- Social domination promotes ideological dualisms, such as:

- Good vs. bad
- Man vs. woman




- Nature vs. culture
- Nature vs. reason
- Nature vs. science





- Domination of the environment starts with social domination of all kinds, not just gender
- The historic emergence of mechanistic worldview caused "The Death of Nature" (1980)






"The female earth was central to organic cosmology that was undermined by the Scientific Revolution and the rise of a marketoriented culture...for sixteenth-century Europeans the root metaphor binding together the self, society and the cosmos was that of an organism...organismic theory emphasized interdependence among the parts of the human body, subordination of individual to communal purposes in family, community, and state, and vital life permeate the cosmos to the lowliest stone."

-- Merchant, The Death of Nature (1980: 278)

- The ideology and practice of industrial capitalism has created today's ecological crisis
- Her conclusion: We need a new
 "partnership ethic"
 with nature







Critique of Eco-feminism

- Not just Western society has ecological problems
- Jared Diamond: Many non-Western and premodern cultures have destroyed environment

Women participate in environmental destruction





Critique of Eco-feminism

Just Another Dualism?

- Sometimes, ecofeminists identify the female with nature – as a positive thing
- This is another dualism, separating men from women
- Celebration of the "Ecofeminine," not ecofeminism?


