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Presentations

- In academia and your future career you might be asked to present:
 - your research (to your peers, supervisor, conference attendants)
 - your position/opinion (at seminars, round tables)
 - a teamwork (assuming responsibility for the others)
 - practical implementation of your design (persuading your audience, clients)
 - yourself (during interviews)



Presentations

- Things to remember:
 - purpose/targeted audience
 - what will be assessed
 - desirable content
 - requirements (timing, use of equipment, interaction with audience...)
 - Q&A session included?
 - outcome (Will my presentation be distributed among the audience? What will be the outcome of the session?)



Some mixed remarks...

- Warm up before giving presentation
 - You will get warmed up eventually but it's better to do it **beforehand**...
- Plan carefully (a rehearsal may be also useful) but...
 - ...not everything should be scripted, **be natural**
- Take your time although time may seem to slow down ©
 - ...but keep up with the time frame (create 'checkpoints')
- Be natural and unnatural at the same time
- Stick to the topic (structure!)
- Mind your language & body language
- Keep contact with audience
- Be convincing but not intimidating
- Leave room for imagination
- Consider audience involvement
