Present Modals

Have to vs Must

I have to do it = I must do it (almost)

I don't have to do it ≠ I mustn't do it



Present Modals

• I don't need to do it = I needn't do it

 I can go home now = I could go home now (just politeness issues)

Probability: may, might, could



Past Modals

He must have done it. (100%)

Form: must + have + 3rd form

- Opposite: He can't have done it. (0%)
- He mustn't have done it does not exist



Past Modals – 50%

- I may have done it.
- He might have done it.
- He could have done it.

- Careful: He <u>could have done</u> it probability
- BUT: He <u>could run</u> fast also past, but ability



Past Modals - Need

- I didn't need to go to the bank
 - = I did NOT go there, I stayed home

Also - I did not have to go to the bank – same meaning

BUT:

- I needn't have gone to the bank.
 - = I went there, but it was closed for example
