- Own language
- Big communities, live outside of the main society
- Music – inspiration for round-Europe-music (folk)

- Concerned – aware of stereotypes
- Attracted to exotic image
- Anxious – due to loudness
- Pleasant surprise
- Related to the idea of otherness
- Admiration for individuals, dancing
- Fear
- Mixture of feelings
- Guilt, realising my own privilege

- Hospital

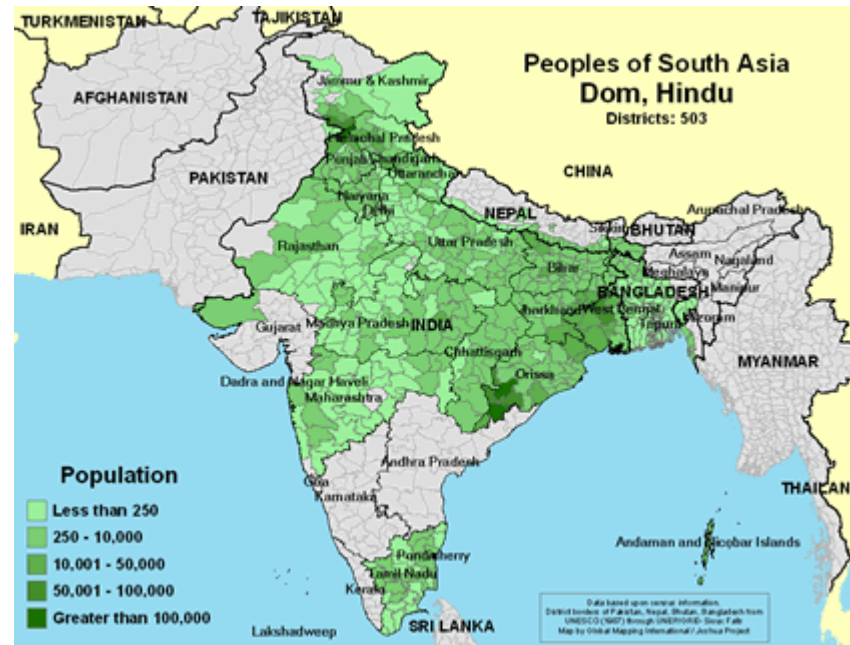
How do you know you are not a Roma?

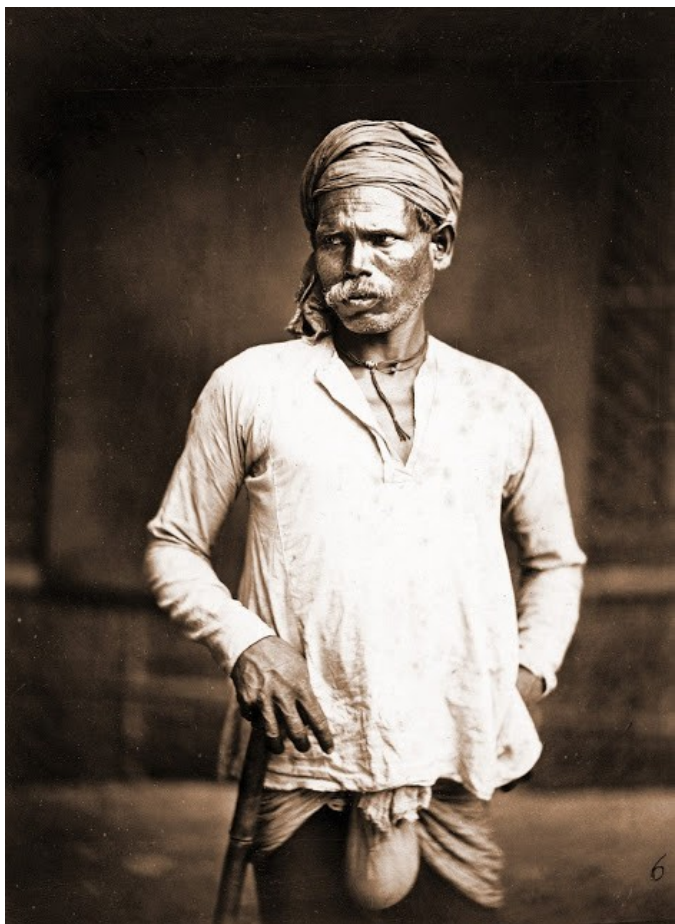
- Noone told me so

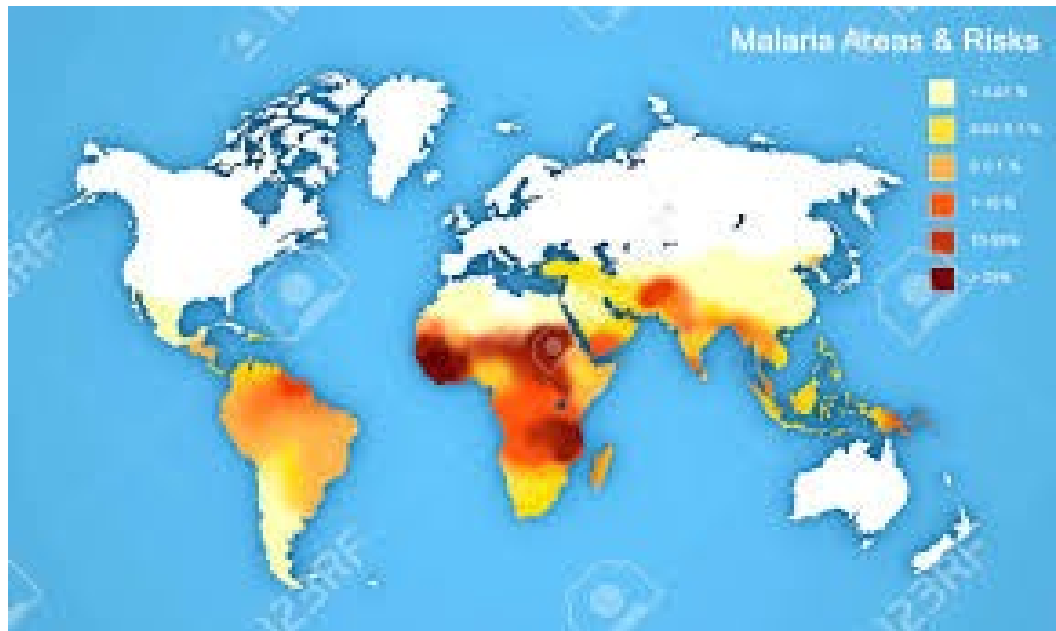
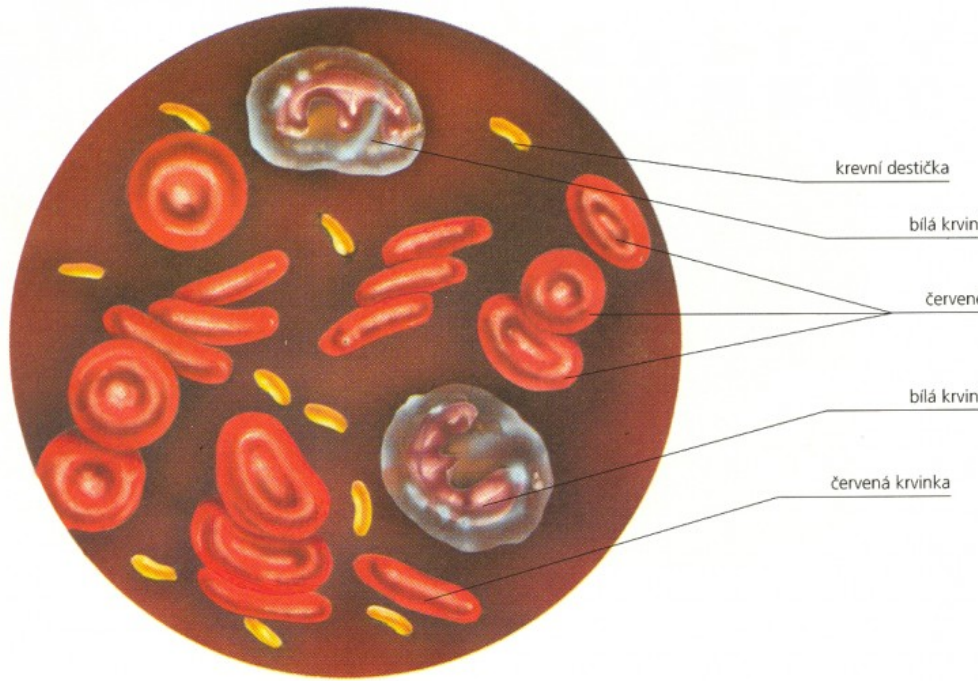

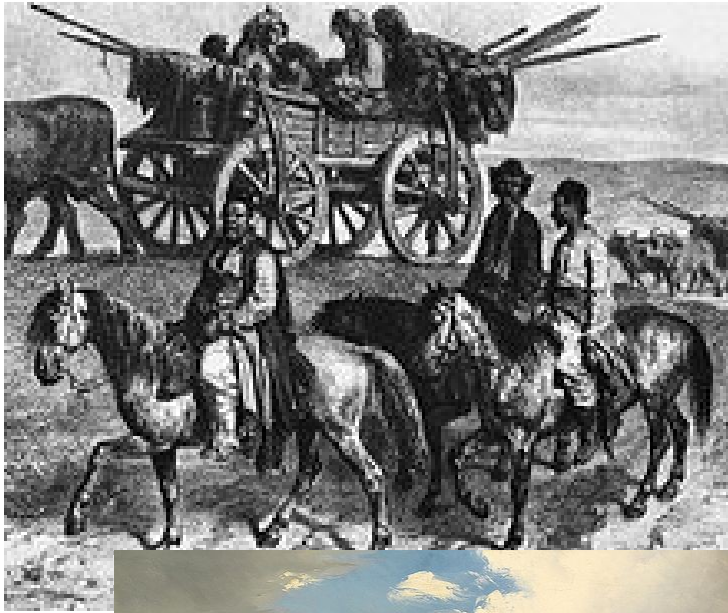
