Objectives of integrated approach:

- to prevent emissions into air, water or soil wherever this is practicable, taking into account waste management or to minimize them
- to achieve a high level of protection for the environment as a whole
- to inform the public of the operation of installations and their potential efffect on the environment

Sources of the Czech law

Act No. 76/2002 Coll., on Integrated Prevention and Pollution Control, as amended

Act No. 183/2006 Coll., Construction Code

IPPC Act – goals:

to achieve a high level of environmental protection

to integrate state administration as to issue one permit for the operation of installation instead of permits issued under different laws

Basic principles of the IPPC:

- Specification of activities
- Best available techniques
- Expertness
- Publicity and participation of the public
- Cooperation
- Complexity
- Prevention

STAGES OF THE IPPC

- Aplication in written and in electronic way
- Application is sent to participants of the procedure, authorities concerned and to Agency or to the other person entrusted with making an expert opinion
- The information on the application and where to look into it and make copies is made public – confidential information is excluded
- Commenting upon the application
- Common meeting of parties
- Decision
- Audit

Duties of the operator:

- to comply with conditions set in the permit
- to report any planned changes
- to report any accident
- record-keeping

Sanctions:

■ fine up to 7 mil. Kč

- the possibility to stop the procedure if:
 - a) the operator has accepted corrective measures
 - b) the fine would lead to unreasonably hard consequences

- MOE and regional authority (permits)
- M of Industry and Commerce
- M of Agriculture
- M of Health
- Czech environmental inspection
- Hygienist
