# 1918 the establishement of the Czechoslovak republic

- Act No. 11/1918 Coll. reception of the law of the Austrian -Hungarian Empire legal dualismus
- Czech lands: CC ABGB (1811)
- Slovakia: Hungarian law (based on legal customs)

+

- Act No. 320/1919 Coll., so called Marriage Amendment
- Act No. 121/1920 Coll., Constitution (new principles: equality between a man and a womam, all children)
- Act No. 56/1928 Coll., Adoption Act
- 1937: legal steps for recodification of CC failed

#### 1939 - 1945 the second word war

(16. 3. 1939 - 8. 5. 1945)

- three catelories of inhabitants:
  - German citizens
  - Citizens of Protectorate
  - Citizens under "racial" rules from Norimberk (15. 9. 1935) on Protection on German Blud and German Honour prohibition of marriages between the German race and Jew
- property aspects
  - Act from 21. 6. 1939 on aryanize of Jewish property

#### 1948 the communist take-over

- Act No. 150/1948 Coll., Constitution
- Soviet pattern atomisation of legal order Czechoslovak-Polish Commision:
  - Act No. 265/1949 Coll., Family law Act
  - Act. No. 141/1950 Coll., CC
  - Act No. 59/1952 Coll., on Marrying Aliens
  - Act No. 69/1952 Coll., Children Act

equality of a man/a woman equality of children no guilty divorce

elimination of church bagatelisation of property in family

#### 1989 the collapse of communism

- the access to the Human Right Conventions
- Amendments to the Act No. 100/1960 Coll., Constitution
- Act No. 23/1991 Coll., Charter of Fundamental Rights and Freedoms
- Act No. 509/1991 Coll., great amendment to CC
- Act No. 234/1992 Coll., amendment to AF (civil wedding)

#### Establishment of the Czech republic

- reception of old laws of the Czechoslovak Republic
- Act No. 1/1993 Coll., Constitution
- Act No. 2/1993 Coll., Charter of Fundamental Rights and Freedoms
- Act No. 91/1998 Coll., great amendment to AF (no ideology, new conception of divorce, parental responsibility, guardianship, maintenance, adoption etc. + community of property of spouses)
- Act No. 359/1999 Coll., Children Act

### 2004 the accession to the European Union

- 1st May 2004
- major changes occurred after 1989 human rights dimension of interpretation and aplication
- old laws from 60' still in force (AF, CC)

- Act No. 422/2004 Coll., on Secret Child Births
- Act No. 115/2006 Coll., on Registered partnership

- early 1990's: prof. Knapp and prof. Plank
- middle of 1990's: *prof. Zoulik*
- 2001: *prof. Eliáš* 
  - great support of the government
  - the draft <u>www.justice.cz</u>
    end of 2009 Parliament www.psp.cz
  - family law: the second part of "draft" Civil Code
  - the main aim:
    - discontinuity with communist law
    - comeback to European Legal Traditons
  - Commission on European Family Law (CEFL) Principles
