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03 FURTHER INVESTIGATION On 7/31/ , I, Det. Grimes, made contact

04 with Leora Yates, hospital social worker assigned to Victim/

05 Shoeman's case. Subject, Yates sent the initial medical reports

06 (See attached) and indicated she would have the attending physician,

07 Dr. Wendy Duck, contact me. Subject/Yates was aware of speculation

08 that Victim/Shoeman's wounds may have been self- inflicted and had

09 met with Dr. Duck concerning that possibility. From that meeting,

10 Subject/Yates provided the following information.

11 Subject/Yates stated that all of Victim's Shoeman's

12 wounds were slices and none were stabs. She indicated that they

13 initially appeared worse because of blood but none were actually deep

14 or overly severe. She indicated there was no evidence of blunt trauma

15 consistent with being struck on the head with a heavy weapon - such as

16 a wrench. Subject Yates stated that she is concerned, from a psycho-

17 logical standpoint, and would not release Victim/Shoeman from the

18 hospital until sure she would not harm herself.

19 Shortly after my conversation with Subject, Yates, Dr. Duck

20 contacted me and indicated that Victim, Shoeman's fiance, Subject/

21 Keting, had mentioned that Victim/Shoeman's attack was possibly

22 a suicide attempt. She stated the wounds could have been

23 self-inflicted, that most of the injury was to Victim, Shoeman's

24 neck and that it would be possible to self-inflict those wounds. She

25 also indicated that, while it is easy to cut your own fingers, the

26 wounds could be either self-inflicted or defensive in nature. Dr.

27 Duck stated that the wounds to the neck, if self-inflicted, would be

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04 ~~made using the right hand (Victim/ Shoeman is right handed). Dr.~~

05 ~~Duck also indicated that a small cut on the top of Victim/ Shoeman's~~

06 ~~head was strange if it were a self-inflicted wound. Dr. Duck stated~~

07 ~~that she can't tell one way or the other with certainty. Dr. Duck did~~

08 ~~indicate that she will have a psychological check of Victim/ Shoeman~~

09 ~~, prior to her release from the hospital, to insure that she is no~~

10 ~~immediate threat to herself.~~

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03 INTERVIEW W/SUBJECT : Keting On 7/31/96, I, Det. Grimes,

04 recontacted subject, Keting and requested he respond to 'PD for an

05 interview. He consented and provided the following information.

06 Subject/ Keting recalled that, on the morning of the

07 incident, he was supposed to meet someone at 8:00 AM at the U-Haul

08 storage area, located on South State Street, Ann Arbor, Michigan. He

09 stated that he woke up late, at approximately 7:45 AM, but had left

10 by 7:50 AM. He said he met "Ted Nunio", the husband of one of his

11 ex-girlfriends (Liisa Nunio).. He related that he and Nunio

12 jointly owned a pavilion, which is used for medieval events, and they

13 needed it out for an upcoming event. Subject/ Keting stated that

14 he was at the storage area just long enough to get the equipment and,

15 at approximately 8:10 AM, he left and went directly to work. He

16 stated that he was called at work by a neighbor, Subject, Manis, who

17 told him that Victim/ Shoeman had been hurt. Subject Keting

18 stated he immediately went to the scene, where he saw

19 Victim, Shoeman: excited. He stated that she looked frightened,

20 anxious, and agitated and the first thing she said was, "It was

21 Carol:". He recalled that Victim/ Shoeman was panicky and short of

22 breath "like after having a nightmare".

23 When he left in the morning, Subject Keting stated

24 Victim/ Shoeman was lying on her stomach in bed, woke long enough to

25 kiss him goodbye, and went back to sleep. He said it was not strange

26 for Victim, Shoeman to be nude because "that's how she normally

27 sleeps". He recalled that he left through the garage door and shut it

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03 relationship. He said he "wouldn't put it past" Victim/ Shoeman to

04 self-inflict her injuries in order to draw him closer to her. He

05 stated that if she had blamed a random, unknown, attacker he would be

06 sure she did it to herself.

07 However, he was not sure her story was fabricated because

08 naming Suspect/ Nosal as the attacker is "Not a sure thing". He also

09 indicated that the severity of Victim/ Shoeman's wounds made it hard

10 to believe that they could be self-inflicted. Subject/ Keting was

11 concerned that no weapon had been recovered and didn't believe Victim/

12 Shoeman could dispose of a weapon without leaving a blood trail.

13 Additionally, he was certain that the suspicious, LADDOK hat belonged

14 to suspect Nosal.

15 Subject/ Keting denied any involvement in the attack and

16 said he had nothing to gain by her death. He stated they had no

17 recent arguments but admitted that in, the prior week,

18 Victim/ Shoeman had confronted him because suspect/ Nosal was

19 dominating too much of his time. He stated that the discussions were

20 civil and they had no disagreements. Subject/ Keting indicated

21 that Victim/ Shoeman's parents own the condominium and pay the

22 mortgage. He stated that he and Victim/ Shoeman are the only

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04 with the opener as he left. He said guests normally come in through

05 the side door but he and Victim/*Shoeman* do not use it and often

06 find it unlocked. Subject/*Keting* indicated that Suspect/*Nosal*

07 knows when he leaves and arrives at work because he stays with her

08 every Wednesday night, on a regular basis. He said she also knows

09 that Victim/*Shoeman*'s schedule varies. However, he related that

10 Suspect/*Nosal* has never just dropped by and has always knocked and

11 waited to be let inside. He indicated that Suspect/*Nosal* does not

12 have a key to the condominium.

13 Subject/*Keting* stated he spoke to Suspect/*Nosal* the

14 previous night, 7/29/ , at approximately 7:45 PM. He said she told

15 him that she was going to be in the area on Tuesday, 7/30/ , and

16 wanted to get together with him. He declined because of prior plans,

17 but indicated that Suspect/*Nosal* did not seem upset and said it did

18 not cause any problems between them.

19 Subject/*Keting* stated that Victim/*Shoeman* had related

20 the attack to him (Note: It was consistent with her report to me).

21 Subject/*Keting* did not seem convinced of the attack stating, "The

22 whole story doesn't ring true". He admitted that he is not sure of

23 the reported attack because "so much evidence doesn't add up" and he

24 does not believe it's consistent with Suspect/*Nosal*'s personality.

25 He indicated that Suspect/*Nosal* had no motive for the attack and

26 that Victim/*Shoeman* "was the one more concerned" over his

27 relationship with Suspect/*Nosal*.. He noted that Victim/*Shoeman*

28 had once made an aborted attempt at suicide because of the loss of a

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03 residents and are responsible for paying the bills. He did not know

04 if victim, Shoeman has a last will and testament. He admitted that

05 she has a trust fund, through her grandparents, but indicated he is

06 "not a beneficiary on anything".

07 STATUS/DISPOSITION Active; pending further investigation

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
