19 Information Services unit. The IM access log showed Suspect/ *Nosal*.

22 Also, Suspect/ *Nosal*'s MCI long distance telephone records

23 were subpoenaed for calls made on Tuesday, 7/30/ . The records

24 indicated that, at 12:41 PM, Suspect/ *Nosal* had called Subject/

25 *Kretzing*'s employer, Expressign Designs. All calls were made in the

26 afternoon, between 12:30 - 1:00 PM, and correlated with

27 Suspect/ *Nosal*'s statement. A total of four calls were made, in

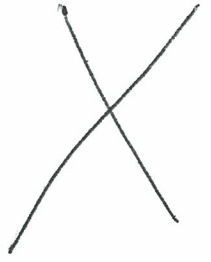

04 DOCUMENTS On 8/12/ , I, Det. Grimes, obtained Victim/Shoeman's

05 official medical records from U of M Hospital (attached). No new

06 information was included. Note, however, that mental health and Dr.

07 Brice's pathology reports were omitted. U of M Medical Records

08 was recontacted and indicated those reports would be forthcoming.

09 Additionally, on 8/12/ , MSP-Northville laboratory reports

10 were received. Results indicated that the hair fibers found at the scene

11 were cut and corresponded to known hair samples from Victim/Shoeman's.

12 Also, six hair fibers were recovered from the "Laddok" ballcap and

13 corresponded to known hair samples from Suspect/Novosel. See attached.

14 FURTHER INVESTIGATION Seeking confirmation/verification of

15 Suspect/Novosel's planned visit on 7/30/ , I attempted to contact

16 Subject/Ayers and Subject/Zody - Pline for any possible pertinent

17 information. Both subjects have been unreachable and neither has

18 recontacted me, at this time.

19 Contact was made with "Ted", Subject/Hatley, who verified

20 Subject/Keting's alibi. Subject/Hatley confirmed that he had met

21 Subject/Keting at U-Haul (S. State St.), to remove a pavilion from

22 storage, on 7/30/ . He recalled that Subject/Keting arrived at,

23 approximately, 8:00 AM and left "15 to 20" minutes later. Note, all

24 information was consistent with Subject/Keting's statement.

25 Additionally, contact was made with "Andy", Subject/Anderso

26 who was the ID card checker at the M.S.U. Intramural Center (gym). She

13 Note, contact was also made with Victim/ Shoeman's mother

14 Subject/ Shoeman confirmed that she had discovered a small gold key, in

15 her daughter's bedroom, after the attack. She said she made the discover

16 on Tuesday, 7/31/ , while cleaning the room. She stated she found the k

17 ,beneath a vanity, at the end of the bed.

Results of Examination:

#1 - #4: The locks and strands of hairs are sharply cut and no roots are present, indicating that the hairs were cut and not pulled from the head. Microscopic examination showed that these hairs correspond to known head hairs from Marly Shoeman and could have originated from her. They are not the same as hairs from Carol Nosal.

Six hairs were recovered from the cap. Examination showed that these hairs correspond microscopically to known head hairs from Carol Nosal, and that they could have originated from her. These hairs are not the same as known hairs from Marly Shoeman.
