Liability of a state

Francovich case

- Italy failed to implement a directive
- Direct effect was not possible
- Solution: liability of a state!
- 3 conditions must be fullfiled:
 - 1. result prescribed by the directive should entail the grant of rights to individuals
 - 2. it should be possible to identify the content of those rights on the basis of provision of the directive
 - 3. existence of a causal link between the breach of the State's obligation and the loss and damage suffered by the injured parties

Brasserie du Pecheur / Factortame

- Where a Member State acts in a field where it has wide discretion, it will be liable to an individual for breach of EC law provided:
- (1) the rule of law infringed is intended to confer rights on individuals;
- (2) the breach is sufficiently serious;
- (3) there is a direct causal link between the breach and the damage

Kobler

 The state is liable even in case of a damage that was caused by breach of EU law by the state's courts of last instance...
