# EU LEGISLATION

#### **CITES:**

- Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein, as amended
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 865/2006 laying down detailed rules concerning the implementation of Regulation 338/97, as amended
- Commission implementing Regulation (EU) 2017/1915 prohibiting the introduction into the Union of specimens of certain species of wild fauna and flora

## Regulation (EC) No 338/97

#### 4 different protection regimes:

- Annex A corresponds to Appendix I of CITES
- ↔ Annex C Appendix III of CITES



wider scope than CITES

### Regulation (EC) No 338/97

#### 03

SPECIMENT 'shall mean any animal or plant, whether alive or dead, of the species listed in Annexes A to D, any part or derivative thereof, whether or not contained in other goods, as well as any other goods which appear from an accompanying document, the packaging or a mark or label, or from any other circumstances, to be or to contain parts or derivatives of animals or plants of those species, unless such parts or derivatives are specifically exempted from the provisions of this Regulation or from the provisions relating to the Annex in which the species concerned is listed by means of an indication to that effect in the Annexes concerned.

## Art. 8 of Regulation 338/97

- 1. The purchase, offer to purchase, acquisition for commercial purposes, display to the public for commercial purposes, use for commercial gain and sale, keeping for sale, offering for sale or transporting for sale of specimens of the species listed in Annex A shall be prohibited.
- 2. Exemption from the prohibitions referred to in paragraph 1 may be granted by issuance of a certificate to that effect by a management authority of the Member State in which the specimens are located, on a case-by-case basis where the specimens:
- (a) were acquired in, or were introduced into, the Community before the provisions relating to species listed in Appendix I to the Convention or in Annex CI to Regulation (IEC) No 3626/82 or in Annex A became applicable to the specimens, or
- specimens; or
  (b) are worked specimens that were acquired more than 50 years previously; or
  (c) were introduced into the Community in compliance with the provisions of this Regulation and are to be used for purposes which are not detrimental to the survival of the species concerned; or
  (d) are captive-born and bred specimens of an animal species or artificially propagated specimens; or

#### C - 154/02 Definition of acquisition

#### CA

C8 'worked specimens that were acquired more than 50 years previously' shall mean specimens that were significantly altered from their natural raw state for jewellery, adornment, art, utility, or musical instruments, more than 50 years before the entry into force of this Regulation and that have been, to the satisfaction of the management authority of the Member State concerned, acquired in such conditions, such specimens shall be considered as worked only if they are clearly in one of the aforementioned categories and require no further carving, crafting or manufacture to effect their purpose;

exemption from the prohibition - just certificate is needed if the specimen was acquired more than 50 years previously

### Regulation (EC) No 338/97

'trade' shall mean the introduction into the Community, including introduction from the sea, and the export and re-export therefrom, as well as the use, movement and transfer of possession within the Community, including within a Member State, of specimens subject to the provisions of this Regulation;

(\* 'transit' shall mean the transport of specimens between two points outside the Community through the territory of the Community which are shipped to a named consignee and during which any interruption in the movement arises only from the arrangements necessitated by this form of traffic: by this form of traffic;

- Resport permit or re-export certificate

IMPLEMENTING REGULATION (EU) 2017/1915 prohibiting the introduction into the Union of specimens of certain species of wild fauna and flora



Restrictions on the introduction to the EU:

- R Macaca fascicularis from Laos;
- ශ Kinyongia fischeri and Kinyongia tavetana from Tanzania;
- R Trioceros quadricornis from Cameroon;
- Real Hippocampus algiricus from Guinea and Senegal;
- CR Ornithoptera priamus from Solomon Islands (wild and ranched specimens)
- 🛯 Pandinus imperator (ranched specimens) from Ghana;
- Phelsuma borai, Phelsuma gouldi, Phelsuma hoeschi and Phelsuma ravenala from Madagascar.

## Regulation (EC) No 338/97

#### CB

Export or re-export from the EU Resport permit/re-export certificate

#### Conditions:

- 3 No harmful effect on the conservation status
- Specimens were legally obtained
- 😋 Risks of injury during the shipment are minimized
- Other requirements are met
- Derogations from conditions (Art. 5(6))

- Specimens of Annex A species born and bred in captivity or artificially propagated treated as Annex B species
- 2. Transit
- 3. Personal and household effects
- 4. Scientific institutions

## Regulation (EC) No 338/97

- CR The prohibition applies to Annex B species which were not acquired legally → how in the light of presumed innocence, may a keeper of animals listed in Annex B prove satisfactorily that his specimens were acquired in accordance with the legislation? (C- 344/08)


- Other requirements
- Movement of live specimens within the EU based on prior authorization (Art. 9)
- 础 Designation of custom offices with trained staff (Art. 12)
- Real Notification/reporting requirements (to the Commission)
- CR Duty to designate management authority with primary responsibility for implementation of this Regulation and for communication with the Commission
- Duty to designate one or more scientific authorities with appropriate qualifications (Art. 13)

#### Enforcement

- ∝ duty to monitor and ensure compliance
- ↔ take appropriate measures to ensure the imposition of sanctions for infringements of the Regulation



- ∝ seizure/confiscation of specimens
- refusal to accept the shipment and return of the specimen to its place of departure

## SEALS REGULATION

#### CB-

- Council Directive 83/129/EEC concerning the importation into Member States of skins of certain seal pups and products derived therefrom
- Regulation (EC) No 1007/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council on trade in seal products.
- harmonize existing national rules regarding the placing on the European Union (EU) market of seal products
   protection of certain seal species
- Reprotection of seal pups against non-traditional hunting.

### Regulation (EC) No 1007/2009

CB-

- **⊗** Seal specimens of all species of pinnipeds.
- Seal product all products, either processed or unprocessed, deriving or obtained from seals, including meat, oil, blubber, organs, raw fur skins and fur skins, tanned or dressed, including fur skins assembled in plates, crosses and similar forms as well as articles made from seal fur skins.
- Inuit indigenous members of the Inuit homeland, namely those arctic and subarctic areas where Inuit have aboriginal rights and interests, recognised by Inuit as being members of their people.

### **Regulation (EC) No 1007/2009**

Prohibition of the trade in seal products

The marketing of seal products is only allowed when they:

- Result from seal hunts traditionally conducted by Inuit and other indigenous people
- Result from by-products of hunting that is regulated by national law, undertaken solely for the purpose of the sustainable management of marine resources.
- ↔ the placing on the market is only allowed on a non-profit basis.

## Regulation (EC) No 1007/2009

## The import of seal products for non-commercial reasons is allowed where:

it is of an occasional nature and consists exclusively of goods for the personal use of travelers or their families.

#### **Fury animals**

Council Regulation (EEC) No 3254/91 prohibiting the use of leghold traps in the Community and the introduction into the Community of pelts and manufactured goods of certain wild animal species originating in countries which catch them by means of leghold traps or trapping methods which do not meet international humane trapping standards

Commission Regulation (EC) No 35/97 of 10 January 1997 laying down provisions on the certification of pelts and goods covered by Council Regulation (EEC) No 3254/91
