

CONDITIONALS

1st conditional

If I fail the exam, I will be sad.

Form

IF + present simple, WILL + infinitive

Meaning

real and probable situation

X

2nd conditional

If I won a million crowns, I would travel round the world.

Form

IF + past simple, WOULD + infinitive

Meaning

unreal and improbable situation

Both, first and second conditionals refer to the future.
