

## LIST OF COMMONLY USED MEDICATIONS

The noun *remedium* and its more frequent plural form *remedia* is usually omitted: thus *abortiva* = *remedia abortiva*.

Latin name	English translation and explanation
1. <i>remedium abortivum</i> <i>abortivus, a, um</i>	<b>abortifacient</b> , a drug inducing or causing abortion
2. <i>remedium anaestheticum</i> <i>anaestheticus, a, um</i>	<b>anesthetic</b> , a drug causing temporary loss of bodily sensations
3. <i>remedium analgeticum</i> <i>analgeticus, a, um</i>	<b>analgetic (analgesic)</b> , a drug relieving pain
4. <i>remedium antacidum</i> <i>antacidus, a, um</i>	<b>antacid</b> , a drug preventing, neutralizing, or counteracting acidity (e. g. of the stomach)
5. <i>remedium antiallergicum</i> <i>antiallergicus, a, um</i>	<b>antiallergic (antiallergenic)</b> , a drug preventing or relieving allergies
6. <i>remedium antibioticum</i> <i>antibioticus, a, um</i>	<b>antibiotic</b> , a drug destroying or inhibiting the growth of other microorganisms
7. <i>remedium anticoagulans</i> <i>anticoagulans, antis</i>	<b>anticoagulant</b> , a drug preventing blood clotting
8. <i>remedium antidiarrhoicum</i> <i>antidiarrhoicus, a, um</i>	<b>antidiarrheal</b> , a drug preventing or stopping diarrhoea
9. <i>remedium antidiureticum</i> <i>antidiureticus, a, um</i>	<b>antidiuretic</b> , a drug limiting the formation of urine
10. <i>remedium antipyreticum</i> <i>antipyreticus, a, um</i>	<b>antipyretic</b> , a drug reducing fever
11. <i>remedium antisepticum</i> <i>antisepticus, a, um</i>	<b>antiseptic</b> , a drug inhibiting the growth of microorganisms and thus preventing infection
12. <i>remedium antispasticum</i> <i>antispasticus, a, um</i>	<b>antispastic (antispasmodic)</b> , a drug relieving or preventing spasms, especially of smooth muscles
13. <i>remedium cardiostimulans</i> <i>cardiostimulans, antis</i>	<b>cardiac stimulant</b> , a drug stimulating the function of the heart
14. <i>remedium contraceptivum</i> <i>contraceptivus, a, um</i>	<b>contraceptive</b> , a drug preventing conception
15. <i>remedium desinfiens</i> <i>desinfiens, entis</i>	<b>disinfectant</b> , a drug preventing infection by inhibiting the growth or action of microorganisms
16. <i>remedium detoxicans</i> <i>detoxicans, antis</i>	<b>detoxicant</b> , a drug counteracting poisoning
17. <i>remedium diureticum</i> <i>diureticus, a, um</i>	<b>diuretic</b> , a drug increasing the formation of urine
18. <i>remedium emeticum</i> <i>emeticus, a, um</i>	<b>emetic</b> , a drug inducing nausea and vomiting
19. <i>remedium expectorans</i> <i>expectorans, antis</i>	<b>expectorant</b> , a drug facilitating the secretion or expulsion of phlegm or mucus from the respiratory tract
20. <i>remedium hypnoticum</i> <i>hypnoticus, a, um</i>	<b>hypnotic</b> , a drug inducing sleep

21. remedium hypotonicum <i>hypotonicus, a, um</i>	<b>antihypertensive</b> , a drug decreasing blood pressure
22. remedium chemotherapeuticum <i>chemotherapeuticus, a, um</i>	<b>chemotherapeutic</b> , a drug that is selectively destructive to malignant cells and tissues
23. remedium laxativum (laxans) <i>laxativus, a, um (laxans, antis)</i>	<b>laxative</b> (purgative), a drug facilitating or increasing bowel movements
24. remedium narcoticum <i>narcoticus, a, um</i>	<b>narcotic</b> , a drug that blunts senses (e. g. opium, morphine, belladonna, alcohol), and that is used in medicine to relieve pain, cause sedation and induce sleep
25. remedium obstipans <i>obstipans, antis</i>	<b>antidiarrheal</b> , a drug providing relief for diarrhoea
26. remedium prophylacticum <i>prophylacticus, a, um</i>	<b>prophylactic</b> , a drug defending or protecting from a disease or infection
27. remedium relaxans <i>relaxans, antis</i>	<b>relaxant</b> , a drug relaxing and relieving muscular or nervous tension
28. remedium sedativum <i>sedativus, a, um</i>	<b>sedative (tranquilizer)</b> , a drug inducing sedation by reduction of irritability or excitement
29. remedium spasmolyticum <i>spasmolyticus, a, um</i>	<b>antispasmodic</b> (spasmolytic), a drug suppressing muscle spasms
30. remedium stimulans <i>stimulans, antis</i>	<b>stimulant</b> , a drug exciting any bodily function, especially those that stimulate the brain and CNS
31. remedium stomachicum <i>stomachicus, a, um</i>	<b>stomachic</b> , a drug stimulating gastric digestion and relieving discomfort of stomach pain
32. remedium vasoconstringens <i>vasoconstringens, entis</i>	<b>vasoconstrictor</b> , a drug that causes narrowing (vasoconstriction) of walls of blood vessels
33. remedium vasodilatans <i>vasodilatans, antis</i>	<b>vasodilator</b> , a drug that causes dilatation (vasodilatation) of walls of blood vessels
