



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Skin tumours

- Malignant
- Benign
- Nevi
- Cysts, warts, scars



Malignant tumours - epithelial

- Basal cell carcinoma
- Squamous cell carcinoma
- Actinic keratoses, cornu cutaneum
- Morbus Bowen
- Keratoacanthoma
- Morbus Paget

Basal cell carcinoma

- Hereditary - Gorlin syndrome
- Long term UV exposition – actinic damage
UVB (UVA)
- Sun exposed areas - face









Squamous cell carcinoma

- Actinic damage – face, scalp, dorsal aspects of the hands
- Chronic wounds – ulcers, ca in lupo
- Chronic dermatoses – lichen verrucosus
- Therapy side-effects – rtg, arsen, UV, cytostatics



- Phototype I, II
- Familiar dysplastic nevi – mutations 9p21
- Actinic damage - sunburn

Malignant melanoma


- ABCD rule
- Asymmetry
- Border
- Colour
- Diameter >5mm
- Evolution

Malignant melanoma

- Superficially spreading
- Nodular
- Acrolentiginous
- Lentigo maligna melanoma

Malignant melanoma

- Histologic criteria
- Breslow < 1mm, < 2mm, more
- Clark I-V

























Lymphomas

- Nodal – pruritus, infiltration, ichtyosis, immunosupresion (scabies)
- Primary skin epidermotropic T cell
 - I.stage – chronic dermatitis
 - II. stage – skin infiltration
 - III. stage – tumours








B cell lymphoma



Kaposi sarkoma – old men - HIV positivity








Metastatic disease

- Melanoma
- Squamous cell carcinoma
- Lung cancer - chest
- Breast cancer – chest, arms
- Renal tumours - scalp
- GIT tumours – navel (sister Mary Joseph nodule)









Paraneoplastic signs

- Ichtyosis
- Pruritus
- Keratoderma palmoplantar
- Dermatomyositis
- Bullous pemphigoid
- Acanthosis nigricans
