language use:

language foregrounded, draws attention to itself (sound, images)

not only WHAT but primarily HOW it is said

Language of science: clear, universal, definite, unambiguous, 1 meaning, 1 interpretation

Literary language: metaphorical, playful, ambiguous, multiple meanings

Language of science refers to the outside world (extralinguistic reality), is a medium only

Literary language: refers to the outside world but also creates a world of its own, medium and ultimate

end, crafted, aesthetic

What is literature for? What is/are its function/s?

Functions of literature:

- aesthetic (pleasure in form)
- informative
- cognitive (recognition)
- didactic (sense of values)
- expressive
- empathic
- cathartic (cleansing)
- entertaining

...

dulce et utile (sweet and useful) HORACE:

pure sound and image, no relation to the human world

art for art's sake - not compulsory marxism (art as "superstructure")

VS

- deserves attention

instruction

- not a bore - not a waste of time

gives a sense of achievement and satisfaction
