



The third conditional

- If SS have a similar tense in their own language, they may not have too many problems with the concept but most SS will have problems with the 'mechanics' of the structure, i.e. remembering which verb form goes in each part of the sentence and also in understanding and producing contracted forms.
- Typical mistakes are:
 - using would have in the if-clause, e.g. If I would have known, I would have done something about it.
 - using the past perfect in both clauses, e.g. If I had known, I had done something about it.


