

## Prepositions of time

### We use

**at** with clock times.

*I'll see you **at 4.15**. The plane leaves **at six**. Call me **at lunch time**.*

**on** with days, dates and expressions like Monday morning and Friday afternoon.

*I'll be at home **on Tuesday**. We get up late **on Sundays**. The meeting's **on June 23<sup>rd</sup>**. I had to work **on Christmas Day**.*

**But we say What time ....?**

*What time is the film?*

### We use

**in** with weeks, seasons, months, years and centuries.

*My birthday's **in March**. Shakespeare died **in 1616**. I always get unhappy **in the winter**.*

**!! We say in the morning, in the afternoon, in the evening, but at night. !!**

*She was born at 6.16 **in the morning**. I work best **in the evening**. This street is very quiet **at night**.*

**!! We say at the weekend, at Christmas, at Easter. !!**

*What are you doing **at the weekend**? Did you go away **at Christmas**?*

**!! We don't use** prepositions before common expressions with **this, next, last** and **every**.

*What are you doing **this afternoon**? Bill was here **last Sunday**. See you **next week**. We go on holiday to the same place **every year**.*

To say **how long** it takes to finish something, we use **in**.

*They built house **in three months**. Your soup will be ready **in ten minutes**.*
