

- Burning witches




První máj (1. 5.)

UNESCO

1. The Ride of kings in Vlčnov, south Moravia

- folklore festival
- every year on the last Sunday of May
- very old tradition



UNESCO

2. Falconry

- traditional activity of hunting using trained birds of prey
- nomination of falconry was a record in terms of the number of countries that proposed it for the list: Belgium, the Czech Republic, France, South Korea, Mongolia, Morocco, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, United Arab Emirates, Syria and Spain.



UNESCO

3. Lent (40 days before Easter)

- shrovetide processions and masks since the 19th century
- most commonly men are disguised, in some villages also women and children
- procession goes from door-to-door in the village

4. Verbuňk

- male saltation dance with no exact choreography rules



UNESCO

5. Puppetry

- The puppetry tradition is developed by a number of festivals in the country. Chrudim, east Bohemia, has had a puppetry museum since 1951, which is the oldest of its kind in Europe.
