PRESENT SIMPLE

FORM

<u>Positive</u>: <u>Negative</u>:

I/You/We/They **start** at 8:00. I/You/We/They **don't start** at 8:00. She/He/It **starts** at 8:00. She/He/It **doesn't start** at 8:00.

Question:

Do I/you/we/they **start** at 8:00? Yes, I do. No, I don't.

Does she/he/it **start** at 8:00? Yes, she does. No, she doesn't.

USE

1 **Facts** which are **always true**The earth goes around the sun.

2 Habitual actions (**routines**, **habits**)
3 **Permanent** situations and states

In the summer, Tom **usually plays tennis twice a week**.

My parents **live** in London. They have been there for 20 years.

Common time adverbials with the Present Simple: always, usually, regularly, every morning, often, sometimes, twice a week, from time to time, occasionally, rarely, seldom, once a month, hardly ever, never.

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

FORM

Positive: Negative:

Subject + to be + verb-ing
I am going outside.
You are going outside....
Subject + not to be + verb-ing
I am not going outside.
You are not going outside....

Question:

to be + subject + verb-ing

Are you going outside? Yes, I am. No, I am not. Is he going outside? Yes, he is. No, he isn't.
