**a/ decide about these 9 stress patterns**  
**b/ practice reading them in a rhythmic way,**  
**following the 3 rules of English stress and**  
**rhythm:**  
**1 You only stress words which you would put**  
**in a text message**  
**2 Stressed syllables come at regular intervals**  
**3 Any unstressed syllables at the beginning of**  
**a stress group are said very quickly.**

### **STRESS PATTERNS**

**1**

We shall be sending samples to the houses.  
It's an amazing technical achievement!  
It was a very memorable occasion.  
He must collect the parcel from the office.  
As has been said, her husband was a bully.  
It was a most incredible adventure!  
You can be sure the question's been debated.  
There were a dozen packets in the locker.  
Will you be coming early in the morning?  
We'll be competing later in the season.

**Pattern 1 done for you as an example:**

**11 syllables, stresses on the 4th, the 6th and the 10th syllable.**

**Now process the remaining 8 paragraphs (containing 10 sentences each of the same pattern) yourself.**

**2**

There should be time to distribute the leaflets.  
Is he to wait till the end of the meeting?  
You should allow them some time for revision.  
As we expected, the men were successful.  
There are reports from the Heads of Departments.  
He must give fuller instructions to guide them.  
It isn't anything like as expensive.

It was a strange but compelling performance.  
There's an immediate demand for recordings.  
The introduction was very impressive.

**3**

It would have been better to introduce them.  
We're to be in Tankerton for the gala.  
It'll be an interesting invitation.  
He'll have been suggested as the successor.  
We'd have introduced you to the conductor.

He's appointed a leader for the orchestra.  
The Commission's reported to the Minister.

She reminded the manager of his promise.

Can you promise the television for Thursday?

We shall want to fix reciprocal agreements.  
You can see a list of members in the office.  
There were two of them, Miss Wilson and her brother.  
To begin with, we must row into the harbour.  
He's delighted at the sales of his invention.  
There's an excellent selection of recordings.  
She's received her invitation to the concert.  
You must study for the scholarship to Oxford.

**8**

He'll be returning to Birmingham in August.  
There are some buckets of water (in the garden).  
We shall be moving to Grantchester (in April).  
It's been an interesting journey for the tourists.  
We'll be at Paddington Station in the morning.  
Did she remember to phone them from her uncle's?  
He was in Nottingham later in the evening.  
He was presented with cheques at his retirement.  
He was at Trinity College for the session.  
We could have rented the villa for the summer.

**9**

It was the finest of its kind that we could buy.  
We were expecting to elect him to the Board.  
We should have liked to be in London for the day.  
Are we agreed upon a holiday in France?  
Will you be carrying the water from the well?  
Can you be certain he'll be there until July?

We must remember to renew it in the Spring.
