Requirements:

 - e-learning courses, etc.
 - you can choose anything that fits you and your interests but remember that you must plan all the details of your activity:
 - e.g. don't write: I'm going to listen to some songs.
 - instead write e.g.: I'm going to listen to the songs of XXX at least XXX a week and I'm going to read their lyrics and choose interesting vocabulary from these songs.
