## 7 Verbs of perception

Verbs of perception, for example, hear and watch, can be followed by the infinitive without to or the -ing form.

I heard someone scream.

I watched him make a toy aeroplane.

I heard someone screaming.

I watched him making a toy aeroplane.

The infinitive form suggests that the verb action happens once and that the whole action is perceived. The -ing form suggests the verb action goes on for some time, and only part of it is perceived. Put the verbs in brackets in the infinitive (without to) or the -ing form.
