# PREPOSITIONS, PREPOSITIONAL PHRASES

## **Prepositions of TIME**

#### IN

We use in with years, seasons and months.

I got married in 2007.

I got married in winter.

I got married in December.

#### ON

We use **on** with days and dates.

I got married on 31st December.

I got married on New Year's Eve.

#### ΑT

We use at with times and well-known holiday periods.

I got married at 3.30.

I got married at New Year.

Here are some other examples you should learn:

- In + the morning, the afternoon, the evening, but at night.
- At + mealtimes (at breakfast, at dinner ...).
- At + the weekend.
- At the moment, at present, at that moment.
- **In** the past, **in** the future.

Remember: we don't use in/on/at when we say "this / last / next".

I'll see you next week.

#### IN

We use **in** to show that something is enclosed or surrounded.

The dog is in the garden.

She is in a taxi.

Put it in the box.

We also use **in** to <u>show position within land-areas</u> (towns, states, countries, and continents). I used to live **in Nottingham**.

#### ON

We use **on** to show position on a horizontal or vertical surface.

The cat sat on the mat.

The satellite dish is **on the roof**.

### ΑT

We use at to show a specific place or position.

Someone is at the door.

They are waiting at the bus stop.

I used to live at 51 Portland Street.

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**WORK + PREPOSITION** (work **in** a town/building, work **on** a project, work **for** a company, work **as** a journalist/an actor, work **with** people/material)
