Divide the tasks. Help each other. Watch the clock.

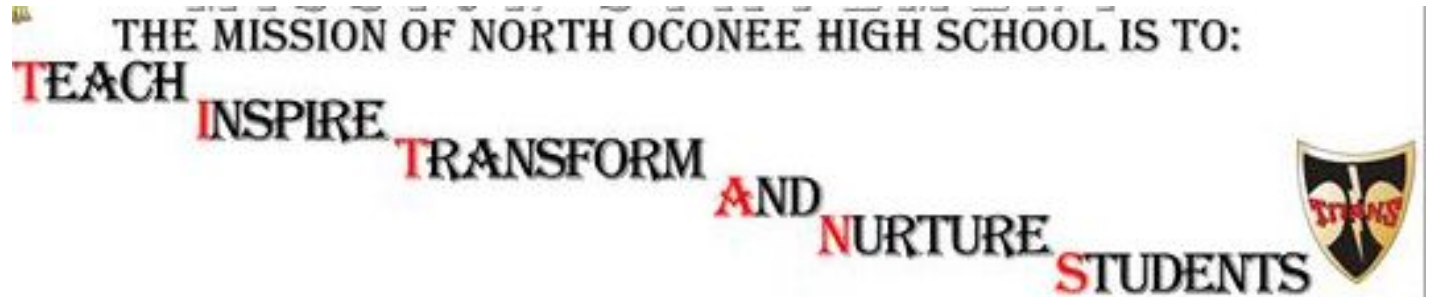
School structure
