# **Learning about vocabulary**

### **Collocation**

A collocation is a pair of words that are often used together. There are many different types of collocation. Here are some examples:

ADJECTIVE + NOUN	private school
VERB + NOUN	do your homework
ADVERB + ADJECTIVE	highly educated
VERB + ADVERB	study hard


Collocations are sometimes very different in English and your first language, for example:

In English we say	We <u>don't</u> say
take an exam	<del>write</del> an exam
make a mistake	<del>did</del> a mistake
a primary school	a <del>basic</del> school
a tall student	a <del>high</del> student

Native speakers will usually understand mistakes like *write an exam*, but learning collocations will help you sound more natural and fluent.

## **Finding collocations with SKELL**

Sketch Engine for Language Learning (SKELL)<sup>1</sup> is an online tool that helps language learners understand more about how words are used in English. The *Word sketch* tool (1) will help you find useful collocations to learn, and the *Examples* tool (2) will show you simple examples of how words and phrases are used in real life.






#### (1) Word sketch

To find useful collocations, enter a word in the search box and click on 'Word sketch' with the mouse. For example, the word *school*:




Here you can see the most useful collocations with the word *school*. To see more information, click on 'Context'.






Now click on a collocation to see example sentences. For example, the collocation attend school:



For common collocations like attend school, you can see up to 40 example sentences.




#### **Practice**


2. Click on the collocations to see example sentences. Write down two or three sentences that show how each collocation is often used in real life.

### (2) Examples

To find examples of words or phrases, enter a single word or phrase in the search box and click on 'Examples' with the mouse. For example, the phrase *graduate from university*:
