| 4. Body language | - eye contact (with the whole class, not only the teacher)
- good use of notes; not reading large parts of the presentation
- stance, enthusiasm |

| 6. Questions | - handling of the discussion
- clear, appropriate responses |
| 7. Sources | - reliability
- bibliography format |
