




At this time Philadelphia was the true mecca of the Rock and Roll world. WCAU (10) and WRCV (3) were original network flagships.



"Bandstand" debuted on October 7, 1952.

On August 5, 1957 the show went national.

The catalogue of work created by The Four Seasons has a unique historic significance and inspired what is arguably the most successful 'jukebox musical' in Broadway history – "JERSEY BOYS."
