
- /v/ - /w/ merger is more characteristic

- /v/ - /w/ merger is expected to be less characteristic




- <th> alveolarisation is more characteristic

- <th> stopping is expected to be more characteristic




- affricates and fricatives are "harder"
- affricates and fricatives are "softer"




- Tendency to partial retroflexion

- Undetermined




-  /ɪ/ > /i/ merger is more characteristic
