

住 zyu6, continuous

1. 住 zyu6 added to a verb describes a continuous activity or state without change. It is associated with particular verbs, such as those denoting stationary situations:

架車阻住個出口。The car is blocking the exit

Gaa3 ce1 zo2 zyu6 go3 ceot1 hau2.

2. 諗住 – intend to, 瞎住 – “look, see”

我諗住請佢哋食飯。I intend to invite/pay them for a meal.

Ngo5 nam2 zyu6 ceng2 keoi5 dei6 sik6 faan6.

你睇住呢兩個細路仔唔好畀佢哋打交。You keep an eye on these two kids, (and) don't let them fight.

Nei5 tai2 zyu6 ni1 loeng5 go3 sai3 lou6 zai2, m4 hou2 bei2 keoi5 dei6 daa2 gaa1.

住 zyu6, continuous

3. Can be used to describe an action carried out simultaneously with another

佢望住我笑 (he/she watching me smiled → he/she smiled (while looking) at me.)

Keoi5 mong6 zyu6 ngo5 siu3

佢對住我喊 He cried at (while facing) me

Keoi6 deoi3 zyu6 ngo5 haam3.

你跟住我行 (you) walk after (following) me

Nei5 gan1 zyu6 ngo5 haang4

緊gan2 versus 住 zyu6

Both are progressive “-ing” forms in English.

緊gan2 is for activities involving change or movement, dynamic

住 zyu6 is for static ones

佢著緊件衫

He/she is putting on clothes

Keoi6 zoek3 gan2 gin6 saam1

versus

佢著住件衫

he/she was/is wearing clothes

keoi6 zoek3 zyu6 gin6 saam1

佢擺緊啲玩具

He/she is fetching the toys

Keoi6 lo2 gan2 di1 wun6 geo6

versus

佢擺住啲玩具

he/she is holding the toys

keoi6 lo2 zyu6 di1 wun6 geo6

1. (Cantonese) Sentence-final modal particle used as a casual reminder or for emphasis.

記住帶多件褛㗎。 [Cantonese, trad.]

记住带多件褛㗎。 [Cantonese, simp.]

Remember to bring a jacket with you.

臨瞓前要刷牙㗎。 [Cantonese, trad.]

You've got to brush your teeth before bed.

I've already eaten.

1. (Cantonese) Sentence-final modal particle used for reported speech.

老師叫我哋去食飯先㗎。 [Cantonese, trad.]

老师叫我哋去吃饭先㗎。 [Cantonese, simp.]

lou⁵ si¹ giu³ ngo⁵ dei⁶ heoi³ sik⁶ faan⁶ sin¹ wo⁵. [Jyutping]

The teacher told us to go eat first.



諗住 nam2 zyu6 – to plan, intend, estimate

2. Number of objects

A measure word (MW) helps describe the quantity and quality (such as distinctive features of shape, natural kind and function) of a noun in counting. A number alone usually cannot function enough as an attributive and must be combined with a measure word inserted between the cardinal number and the noun it modifies.

Numeral + Measure Word + Noun/Nominal phrase

For example: CD -T47

Here are some common measure words: CD -T46

1)	gó³	個	<i>for persons; round objects; abstract things, such as questions or ideas</i>
2)	gåa³	架	<i>for vehicles; machines, e.g. cars, airplane.</i>
3)	gīn⁶	件	<i>for upper body items of clothing, e.g. shirt, coat.</i>
4)	gāan¹	間	<i>for buildings; houses; rooms</i>
5)	bún²	本	<i>for books; magazines</i>
6)	zék³	隻	<i>for most animals; ships; one of a pair</i>
7)	dēoi³	對	<i>for a pair of objects, such as shoes, hands, chopsticks</i>
8)	tìu⁴	條	<i>for streets or things that are long and narrow</i>
9)	zōeng¹	張	<i>for paper; cards; objects with a flat surface, such as chairs, tables, etc.</i>
10)	zī¹	枝	<i>for objects that are cylindrical, rigid, long and thin, e.g. pens, cigarettes</i>
11)	būi¹	杯	<i>literally a “cup”, for the quantity of something that a cup will hold</i>
12)	wún²	碗	<i>literally a “bowl”, for quantity of something that a bowl will hold</i>
13)	dīp⁶	碟	<i>literally a “plate”, for quantity of something that a plate will hold</i>
14)	gün³	罐	<i>literally a “can”, for quantity of something that a can will hold</i>
15)	fān⁶	份	<i>for objects in a set, such as documents, newspapers; a sandwich or a job</i>





噉 gam2 – such; like this; this way; in that case

囉 lo1 lo4 lo3 - [final particle] showing argumentative mood or making emphasis; expressing a changed condition
