

FREEDOM IN THE WORLD 2022

Freedom in the World is a report published annually by Freedom House (founded in 1941 in the US, an independent watchdog organization, nonpartisan).

Freedom in the World 2022 evaluates the state of freedom in 195 countries and 15 territories during calendar year 2021. Each country and territory is assigned up to 100 points. At the top of the list, there is Norway, Sweden and Finland, at the bottom there is Turkmenistan, Tibet, Syria and South Sudan.

The methodology is derived from the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Freedom in the World analyzes the electoral process, political pluralism and participation, the functioning of the government, freedom of expression and of belief, associational and organizational rights, the rule of law, and personal autonomy and individual rights.
