 - o Ukraine 2004
 - The election results were challenged by Yushchenko and his supporters, with many international observers claiming that the election was rigged- Orange Revolution- a re-run second round election
 - o Belarus 2010
 - crackdown on opposition- The Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE) called the election "flawed", saying it fell well short of democratic standards. The Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS) recognized the election as legitimate.

 - thanks to the volunteering and knowledge of Russian and English (Russian necessary for communication with partners, English necessary for projects – foreign funding). They would have preferred me to know more about Czech politics and journalism and project management. Willingness to travel frequently required.
 - o Coordination of events:
 - Decentralization study trips for Moldovan and Ukrainian mayors to the Czech Republic– inspiration.
 - Study trips for activists and lawyers from Belarus ombudsperson's office, constitutional and supreme court, Bar Association, environmental organizations, organizations working with the disabled...
 - Meetings of Belarusian pro-democratic activists and politicians with Czech journalists, Czech MFA, members of parliament as well as the Prime Minister –in order to promote continuous support to Belarus, for example: grants for human rights organizations, scholarships for students expelled for their civic engagement, asylum for political refugees, health care for those who suffered beatings or torture during protests or imprisonment
 - Exhibition political repressions also support to the families of politically persecuted
 - One World film festival of documentary movies with HR topics we invite and accompany the movie authors, protagonists or activists able to comment discussions after the movie screenings, moderating the discussion
 - Very often I would also interpret the meetings
