- i) Applicable only to short texts. Generally it may vary from 50 to 300+ words.
- j) Never. It should be written in the third person; sometimes first person plural is acceptable.

- \$1 Not acceptable because of the additional information that is not mentioned in the original (e.g. ...).
- \$2 Acceptable.
- \$3 Not acceptable too long; exact copying of parts of sentences.
- **S4** Not acceptable opinions, use of "I", does not provide the gist of the text.
- **\$5** A good descriptive summary, however not acceptable as it does not convey any information.

(In academic environments informative summaries are preferred.)

- **3** The first statement is inaccurate.
- 4 Accurate, but too brief and general.
- 5 Inaccurate very loosely linked to the source text.
- 6 Inaccurate the writer does not suggest that biopolitics "is likely to gain increasing acceptance" or that "changes in the environment and in human behaviour can be brought about through political processes". The last statement is also untrue.
- **7** Grossly inaccurate additional information and a concluding statement that has no basis in the source.
