## Presentation Assessment Criteria – CJVA1B,CJVA1M,CJVA2B,CJVA2M

Consider the following criteria before making your presentation:

1. Organisation	- preparedness - logical sequence	- introduction - purpose statement - sign-posting language - key points - conclusion - closure - timing
2. Content	- topic coverage	<ul> <li>relevant to humanities and social sciences         <ul> <li>informative</li> <li>understandable</li> <li>interesting</li> <li>entertaining</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
3. Language	- appropriate to audience - explanation of jargon - voice - speed - volume - clarity - intonation - grammatical accuracy - correct pronunciation of key words	
4. Body language	<ul> <li>e - eye contact ( with the whole class, not only the teacher)</li> <li>- good use of notes; not reading large parts of the presentation</li> <li>- stance, enthusiasm</li> </ul>	
5. Visuals	- appropriate - supportive - clear	
6. Questions	- handling of the discussion - clear, appropriate responses	
7. Sources	- reliability - bibliography format
