- Hierarchy of images
 - Verbalized imagery
 - Non-verbalized imagery

Metadescription and metaimage


- Metaimage
 - A gestalt image
 - Not verbalized
 - Correlates with compositional structures
 - Perceived subconsciously
 - Influences the perception of the text
 - Reconstructed via foregrounded elements from connotative meanings

Metadescription and metaimage

- Metaimage
 - Mapping of conceptual domains behind conceptual metaphors and metonymies
 - Based on tropes
 - Based on semantic coherence of verbal imagery

Metadescrition and metaimage

- •Eco's Semiotics and the Philosophy of Language
 - Micrometaphorics: level of words and word combinations
 - Metaphorics of the context: connecting metaphoric fields
 - Metaphorics of the text: ideological key



Case study: CM and CMt in metadescription

Metaimages	Verbal images
A DAY ON THE ISLAND IS	– the proud watchful mountains that look down upon all $(IF, 506)$
A SAD PERSON	- the forest that sigh in uneasy slumbers $(IF, 506)$
	- the waters that silently smile (IF, 506)
	– <u>meek</u> hand <u>maiden</u> is the moon (IF, 507)
	 – sad rivers and melancholy tarns writhing and sleeping
	within all $(IF, 508)$ – that it was scarcely possible to say at which point
	upon the slope of the emerald turf its [water] <u>crystal dominion</u> began (IF,
	509)
A NIGHT ON THE ISLAND	- the sunset fountains of the sky (IF, 509)
IS A SLOW DYING	 [trees] wreathing themselves into sad, solemn, and spectral shapes that
	conveyed ideas of mortal sorrow and untimely death (IF, 509)
	– The shade of the trees fell heavily upon the water, and seemed to bury
	itself therein, impregnating the depth of the element with darkness (IF,
	509)
	– [each shadow] separated itself sullenly from the trunk that gave it birth,
	and thus became <u>absorbed by the stream</u> (IF, 509)
	– while other shadows issued momently from the trees, taking the place of
	their predecessors thus entombed (IF, 509)
	– the sun rushed down to his slumbers (IF, 510)
THE FAY IS A ROWER TO	- she [Fay] has <u>floated</u> through her winter and through her summer (IF,
THE LAND OF DEATH	510)
	– [Fay's shadow] was swallowed up in the dark water, making its
	blackness more black (IF, 511)
